
Silent Day of Prayer "True Growth in Prayer

A Word from Father



Dear Friends,

A sure sign that the "church year," (not the liturgical one, but the one that roughly follows the school year), has gone on summer hiatus is the number of times we pastors hear the words, "Sorry, won't be here for a few weeks, Father; we'll be at the lake." I can testify that the quantity of such happy declarations has taken a significant upswing now that school is out and summer weather seems to finally be settling in. We'll miss you lake folks on these summer Sundays, of course, but I'm happy you have the opportunity to enjoy this lovely bit of God's glory in our Spokane backyard...whichever "lake" it is that is "the lake" for you.

Some of you may know that a number of us Spokane Diocesan priests have a lake place, too. It is a very rustic cabin out on what is called the Peninsula at Newman Lake. It even has a name: *Saint Philip's Villa*. Way back when, long before I was even a twinkle in the bishop's eye, a group of priests decided it would be good for the fraternity of our diocesan priests to have such a place where they could gather, relax, and just enjoy each other's company...and cooking. They searched for just the right spot for some time until they found this lovely piece of God's Country that was then called "Rockhaven." They made themselves into a non-profit corporation, chipped in together, and bought it, and it has been our haven away from the city ever since and continues to serve its original purpose. I've been a member since ordination in 1979, but haven't had too many opportunities to make use of it since I've mostly worked too far away to make it practical, but I've paid my dues and occasionally had the opportunity to enjoy its tranquility and peace. I was out there just this past week for our priests' prayer group...it was rainy and cold, but the great hearth that has warmed us across the years did its good work for us once again, (courtesy of Father Haspedis, who kept the flames lively and full). Following lunch, I had a good nap in front of the fire, a reminder that rest is good and quiet is of God.

May these summer days and nights be a time of rest, refreshment, and prayer for all of you!
