




Thanksgiving Mass


ACA 2018

A Word from Father

Dear Friends.

Let me share with you this weekend a few thoughts about the wonderful Catholic school we share with Saint Augustine and Cathedral parish, Cataldo.



If you are not a Cataldo parent, you might not know that over the past several months there has been a major change in how the school is governed. For some seven or eight years the school had been governed by a lay-board consisting of up to fourteen persons, including one of the three pastors. This was established following some financially tumultuous times and there were good reasons for going that direction, unusual as it was for an elementary school in our diocese.

Concerned about the parish identity of the school, Bishop Daly mandated last spring that the ultimate governance of Cataldo should return to the three pastors involved in the school. The former school board was legally transformed into the new Board of Governors consisting of Fathers Mee, Connall, and myself. Once established, the Board of Governors set up a new School Advisory Committee made up of parents representing the various parishes as well as a new Finance Committee. Representing Sacred Heart on the School Advisory Committee are *Molly Hughes*, a long-time Cataldo teacher and former Vice-Principal, and *Sarah Nicolarsen*, parent of two young daughters in the school. Representing Sacred Heart on the new Finance Committee is *Aggie Patterson*, also chairperson of our own Finance Council and a CPA now working for Catholic Funeral Services/Holy Cross Cemetery.

It has taken several months to get these new advisory and governing bodies up and running and we are still learning as we go, but things are taking on good shape. Overall, I am really very pleased at the progress we have been making on all fronts. Fathers Mee, Connall, and I have been developing our new working relationship with one another, with the school administration, and our new committees. The three of us have a trusting and respectful relationship, which makes discussing the issues of the day and making needed decisions a very positive experience. We've been putting in a lot of hours in meetings and consultations that we didn't have before the new arrangement, but it has been worth it as we strive together to make Cataldo the best Catholic parochial school it can be for the good of our wonderful Cataldo kids. I know that Father Mee and Father Connell join me in feeling plenty of gratitude to our teachers, administrators, and parents for their patience, respect, and great concern for the school and its mission. With so many children, so many parents, so many teachers and administrators involved in the Cataldo community there will always be issues to be resolved, concerns to be addressed, and great goals to be achieved. Working together on these things with hope, faith, and love is the challenge of this day and every day as we form the next generation of Catholics and parishioners!
