



A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

As you know, this weekend, I am in Albuquerque this weekend and the coming week leading the parish community of St. Therese in its Lenten Mission. Please keep me and the parishioners in your prayers over these coming days that our time together will be one of true renewal and coming to know more deeply the extraordinary mercy of the Father for all of us!

I also want to take this opportunity to update you a bit on our "ambo project" and the decisions that have been made by our Pastoral Council with the input of our parish Liturgy Committee.

Many of you sent to us very thoughtful commentaries and thoughts about the various options we put before you before Christmas. All of the comments have been carefully reviewed and the following decisions now made:

- ☐ We are going to go ahead with planning for a new ambo where the Scriptures are proclaimed in our church. It will be made of white Carrera, feature carved undulating lines (symbolizing the "Ruah" of God...God's Breath...God's Spirit) and a cruciform image of the Four Evangelists symbolizing the Gospels which hold pride of place in the Liturgy of the Word. On the top of the ambo will be inscribed the opening words of the Gospel of John: "And the Word was made flesh and pitched his tent among us."
- ☐ We will *NOT* be making any changes to the tabernacle area of the sanctuary.
- ☐ We will probably also be adding some Carrera touches to the candle sticks and processional cross. Details to be worked on still.
- ☐ Further on, we may also make some changes to the presider's chair to make it more significant as one of the three liturgical focal points of the sanctuary (besides the altar and ambo) and also more closely match the altar and ambo in its "look." Those design changes have yet to be planned.

Thank you so much all who responded to our earlier questions about this project; we all really appreciate your input and your thoughtful responses. They were very important to us in moving ahead appropriately.

Looking a few years further ahead, we are also hoping to do some work on the church to expand and make more accessible the bathrooms in the vestibule and the HVAC system in the church so that it can be air-conditioned in the summer months, but those are projects on which planning has yet to begin in any serious way.
