
Outreach Offering: \$ 248.00

For those who do not already have the book, preorders and prepayment will be made very easy!


Those who have participated in Andi's book studies in past years know that they are always well-planned, thoughtful, insightful, and fun!

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

My Uncle Maurie and Aunt Flo were pretty special people. Maurie was my mother's youngest brother, and obviously, Flo was his wife; together they had eight children, all more or less the same ages as our Codd brood. Once every summer, we'd get together at our place on Lower Twin Lake. They'd drive up from Richland, Yakima, or Ellensburg (wherever "home" was for them...Uncle Maurie worked for a Yakima bank and was moved from branch to branch across the years). With our eleven and their eight, not to mention Mom and Dad, Aunt and Uncle, we pretty much overwhelmed our cabin for a week. The logistics of finding sleeping quarters for so many, not to mention feeding this gang three times a day must have been something! I don't know how it was all done, but however our elders managed it, for us kids, it was absolutely the funnest week of the year! The amount of play we could fit into one day was pretty amazing, most of it took place down on the dock with watery horseplay, but we also took plenty of time to seek out adventures by tromping through the nearby woods looking for snails or collecting beer bottles along the dusty road to redeem at the small grocery store for penny candy. My cousin, Maureen, was my own age, and she and my sister, Patty, and my little brothers, Nick and Lou, would play at being wild horses, galloping, neighing, bucking and letting fly our tails made of iris fronds (collected from the unkempt garden near the old outhouse).

The old people had fun, too. Uncle Maurie challenged my dad to swim across the lake. We cheered them on, hiding our worry that our dad might not have been in good enough shape to make it, but both did...my pop barely.

Dinner time was barbecue time, and that was men's work in those days...the only time the men of the family cooked as far as I can remember. The old circular barbecue on spindly aluminum legs was loaded with briquettes, lit up with plenty of fluid to make the whole thing flare for a few moments with crazy flames, then the hamburger patties Mom and Aunt Flo had handmade were thrown on while the buns, mustard, ketchup, and pickles laid out for our kiddie creativity in putting the whole thing together.

Uncle Maurie, always our favorite uncle, passed away last year and I was honored to preside at his services in Ellensburg. I visited Aunt Flo earlier this summer and enjoyed breakfast with her the Sunday following the Williams wedding. She was in great shape at 95 and asked about each of my siblings and we remembered fondly those weeks together out at the lake. She, too, went to God just the other day. My cousin, Maureen, told me that she finished my book just a few days earlier and that it helped her be ready for death. I will head to Ellensburg next weekend for her funeral Mass and burial. It will be also a great reunion of the Dufaults and the Cods and we will surely tell stories of our happy days together out at the lake!
