Sponsored by our 8th Grade class, we will have a haunted house, games, cakewalk, silent auction, food and fun for all!


Proceeds will benefit the 8th Grade trip to Nature Bridge.

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

With all the not-so good news from everywhere else, who could be blamed for not paying the highest attention to the good news coming from Rome these past few weeks? The fact is that for Catholics around the world, two major news stories emanating from the Vatican are of immense importance to us and deserve our serious attention.

The first is the on-going *Synod on Youth* that has brought together not just bishops from around the world, but plenty of young people with their characteristic vitality and hope for the future. The bishops have done a lot of listening and conversing with the 36 young people participating; what will come of that interaction, we'll have to wait and see. In the short term, a final document signed by Pope Francis, will give some important directions, but the Synod, taking place in the midst of one of the Church's greatest crises, holds the potential to dramatically alter the trajectory of the Church in the coming century. Stay tuned!

The second event worth our attention took place this past Saturday. Pope Francis canonized (fancy Vatican word for "made saints") among others, *Pope Paul VI* and *Archbishop Oscar Romero*. The first, most of us remember well; Pope Paul was the first pope I ever saw in person, (Christmas Midnight Mass, 1975), and the pope who had the difficult job of completing the Second Vatican Council that John XXIII had begun, and then initiating the directives of that Council. The second, Archbishop Romero, was the bishop of San Salvador, the capital city of El Salvador, Central America, as the country was heading towards a bloody civil war in the 1970's. Reacting to the murder of one of his own priests, Father Rutilio Grande, Archbishop Romero became one of the most passionate and vocal critics of the government forces responsible for the worst of the violence in his country. Each time he spoke out in a homily or speech, it would be broadcast on radio across the nation. And each time he spoke out, as his friends warned him, the government was preparing a bullet for him. In fact, on March 28, 1980, he was shot to death by a military squad as he was saying Mass; the witness of a shepherd giving his life for his sheep. (A movie about him was made some years ago; it was titled simply, *Romero*, and is well worth watching).

It is right and fitting that both Pope Paul and Archbishop Oscar Romero are now recognized as saints of our Church. Through their intercession and the conversations taking place among young and old at the Synod on Youth, may our Church become the Community of Saints and Holy Ones, committed to justice and mercy, that the Lord urges it to become!
