A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

After a rather intense week on the stage with our Cataldo kids and with Catholic Schools Week set to begin next Sunday, this is a fine time to share a few thoughts about my experience with Catholic Schools in general and with Cataldo in particular.

As many of you know, I grew up within the Catholic School system...from First Grade to PhD, every day of my academic life has been within the Catholic School community and I am deeply grateful to Saint Charles, Gonzaga Prep and University, and the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium for all they provided to me by way of academic education and personal formation along the way. I know well that so much of who I am today is the fruit of that extended participation within our Catholic schools. Our Catholic schools have a very special charism of being free not only to educate the mind and heart, but also to feed the spirit of our children by explicitly teaching the Christian way of faith, hope, and love in our classrooms, gyms, stages, and sports-fields.

In particular, I am immensely impressed with the generosity and professional acumen of our Cataldo administrators and teachers; I watch them often work their "magic" with the children they have been give to care for and am deeply touched by their particular charisms of creativity, patience, respect for each child, not to mention the sharing of faith and prayer that they do day in and day out. The Thursday Mass with the kids is always for me a special joy because I get to work in advance with both the kids and the teachers in making the liturgy something that will touch their young hearts and give them a graced memory to take home with them at the end of the day.

There are many signs that our efforts at Cataldo are bearing much fruit in the lives of our kids. Not long ago at our Mass on "Grandparents Day," I asked some grandparents what they loved about their grandson or daughter, then asked the kids what they loved about their grandmas and grandpas; the answers going both ways were so touching...everything from "grandma's cookies" to "he is so kind to his little brothers."

While at Ferris High School this past week, I also had the opportunity to run into some of our Catholic school and parish kids who now attend there; they too, along with our parishioners who teach there and at other public schools, also do so much to share their Christian values within the public school milieu. They are true disciples in the world and I am very grateful for their witness at Ferris and the many other public schools where they serve.

I had great fun being the Grinch for a week, but am happy to settle back down into just being me again! I am wondering though, when the catchy tunes and verses will take leave of my brain so that I can go to sleep again without *Seussical* numbers filling my head! "A person's a person, no matter how small....!"
