A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

For many, summertime is travel-time, as it is for me, this year at least. I usually like to split my annual vacation at least into two, sometimes even three, parts and spread those parts around the year a bit, but this year that hasn't been possible. Since early fall, I have been carefully scanning my calendar for upcoming events and then by mid-fall, found one of the few "openings" I had was the coming stretch from just after Pentecost through the month of June (and a few days of July). I will be joining my friend from Albuquerque, Father Vincent Chávez, and travelling to the Philippines where we will be visiting several young priests who were among the seminarians in formation that we guided along. They've now been pastors, professors, seminary staff themselves for over ten years, so it will be wonderful to catch up with them and hear the stories of their early years as priests.

I will also be visiting some friends in Manila and have been invited by my friend, Msgr. Matt Garcia, to preside and preach the 10:00 am Mass in his large parish, St. Alphonsus, in central Manila. We will have lunch afterwards with the parents of one of our WSU grad students who live nearby.

If you have ever been to the Philippines, you know it is hot and humid there just about all year long (prepare to sweat!), but you also know that they are a people marked by two wonderful qualities: hospitality and faith! There is little more important to a Filipino than warmly and effusively welcoming a visitor and doing so especially by preparing a grand meal of endless variety. More important even than their sense of welcome and hospitality is their profound faith as Catholic Christians; their churches are full every Sunday at multiple Masses and almost everyone (and every vehicle) graciously shows for their faith with joy. It will be a joy to be back! See you in July!
