
As of this writing, we have surpassed our fundraising goal of \$150,000, and are currently at \$179,845 in pledges. We so greatly appreciate your generosity!



Church Safety, Delta Edition

The CDC recently issued new recommendations for mask-wearing indoors. Because of the escalating infections due to the delta variant, they now recommend that in regions where infection rates are rising, **all wear masks and observe social distancing in indoor venues, even those who have been fully vaccinated.**

Out of concern for all, we **strongly recommend** that our Sacred Heart parishioners return to wearing masks in church or in the social hall and be careful to maintain the 6' social distancing we have been observing throughout the pandemic.



A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

"Smoke Gets in Your Eyes" was a popular song way back in the 1930's and again in the late 1950's; its composers, Jerome Kern and Otto Harbach, could not have had in mind way back then the reality we have been recently facing in our world of way too much smoke getting in our eyes, our noses, and even down into our lungs. The wildfires that have eaten through thousands of acres of forest and range land across the Western U.S. and even Hawaii and Greece have sent great clouds of the stuff sailing across the face of the globe. Here in Spokane, it has been mostly manageable so far this summer, better than last year, and for most of us, not much more than an irritant that keeps us inside with our windows closed a few days a week. It doesn't fundamentally change our lives. But for those close to the flames, these fires and the smoke they produce to life and property are a danger that is immense and potentially life-ending. Those called to actually fight those fires face daily threats to life and limb, and the smoke we just get whiffs of, they inhale in great quantities day in and day out as they struggle to create lines and hold them...and yet they do so without complaint or hesitation. I admire them so much and each time I feel annoyed by a rise in the local AQI because I can't get out for my walk, I have to think of those men and women out on the frontlines who are fighting these flames for us, be grateful for them, and say a prayer for their safety and the success of their terribly difficult work.

Similarly, when I feel annoyed by having to still be putting on a mask because of mutating coronaviruses, I have to think of our other frontline workers who day in and day out risk their health and even their lives to care for those hospitalized with covid-19. Our doctors, nurses, and aids on the frontlines of this disease deserve the same respect, gratitude, and all the prayers I can muster, for the conflagration they fight is of a different type, but just as potentially devastating to so many.

We can and must support our frontline firefighters by practicing extreme caution with anything that might start a new fire. We can and must support our frontline caregivers by practicing anew social distancing, mask-wearing, and promoting the full vaccination of our country and our world. This is the only way to get the smoke out of our eyes and the virus out of our bodies for the health and safety of all.
