

Please also be attentive to maintaining at least *6' social distance* between yourselves and others outside your family group while in church.




Thank you for your continued patience and perseverance!

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We hear the story in Luke's Gospel telling us that Mary and Joseph were in Bethlehem when Mary was about to give birth to her Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It happened that she had to wrap him in swaddling clothes and lay him in a manger "because there was no room for them in the inn."
