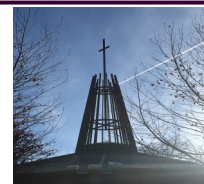

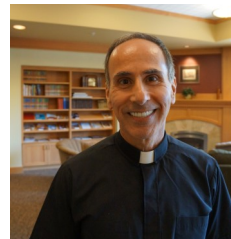
2022 Bishop's Collection for Catholic Schools

The Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

This coming Friday we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, the patroness of our diocese. And our cathedral, as we know, is named in her honor.

In addition to the feast day, this Friday is also *World Day of the Sick*. With that in mind, I want you to always know that I am available to visit the sick and administer the holy oils to them in the sacrament we call *Anointing of the Sick*. Just give me a call.

Along those same lines, please know that you can contact me when a loved one is near the end of their earthly life so that I can provide them with the Eucharist for the last time. We call this Viaticum, which means: food for the journey. I know that those dying, along with their family members, find comfort when the Church, in the presence of the priest, is there to extend the love of God at the hour of death.

I wrote a post on twitter last week that read: "After I give viaticum to someone who is dying, I always ask God to please send a priest to give me Holy Communion and the apostolic pardon at the hour of my death."

That post got a lot of traction, which impressed upon me the great importance others place on that sacrament. All of our sacraments are mystery and a direct way in which God comes to us.

People care so deeply for the sick, suffering, and dying. We will especially remember them on the World Day of the Sick.
