Dear Parishioners and Friends of Saint Teresa Church,

Happy Labor Day weekend to everyone! Welcome to new parishioners moving into our community, and welcome back to people who were away for awhile. We are glad to have you with us, and I have a lot of brief reports to give you.

* We have a visiting priest with us for two more weeks. Fr. Philip Amankwa-Danquah, who served at several NY parishes while studying at Fordham University, is now a professor at the Catholic University of Ghana. His homily last Sunday about the sexual abuse scandal facing our church drew applause, and complemented the August 20 letter from Pope Francis that was printed in the bulletin. There is so much sadness here, and so much that needs to be uncovered. None of us knows yet all that happened in the past. Our faith community is necessarily beginning a time of shame, examination, accountability, and change. Prayer, penance, and purification are required.

But we always have hope. Jesus is the Head of our Church, and He is our way to salvation. Even our human sins and bad decisions do not change that. He has not left us; we cannot leave Him! He makes good come from evil. I was reminded of that at a Funeral Mass this week at the Motherhouse of the Sparkill Dominican Sisters in Rockland County. Sister Joanne Deas, O.P., was the Principal of Our Lady of Grace School in the Bronx when I was a newly ordained priest. Long ago when she planned the Bible readings for her funeral, she chose the Gospel of Saint John, chapter 15. Jesus calls himself the vine, and his Father the vine grower. We all listened intently to this. Sometimes dead branches need to be gathered and thrown into the fire. But even the good branches need to be pruned {i.e., cut back} so that later on they will be able to bear more fruit. Pray that this may be so.

- * We will have two Masses tomorrow for Labor Day, at 8:30am and 12 Noon. We will ask God in the Opening Prayer of the Mass for the Sanctification of Labor: "Listen to the supplications of your people, and grant that all men and women may find work that befits their dignity, joins them more closely to one another, and enables them to serve their neighbors."
- * Our excellent Saint Teresa School will have its first day of classes for Grades K to 8 this Thursday, September 6th. Two full classes of Pre K for All students get a head start on Wednesday. Please remember to be extra careful while you are driving, and extra patient with other drivers. Remember that there are speed cameras along Victory Blvd. to encourage good behavior.

Mrs. Anna Simione is beginning her fourth year as Principal, and our students' test scores have been exceptionally good. Don't hesitate to call St. Teresa's if you want to meet with her and see our school in action. Her number is 718 448 9650.

- * I am also very proud of our Religious Education Program for public school students, led by Mrs. Lisa Rametta. We have excellent teachers and aides, and would like to have additional volunteers so we can do more. We want every child to have a religious education. Due to Rosh Hashanah on September 11, the first day of classes for grades 1 to 8 will be Tuesday Sept. 18. Each Tuesday children come to our gym from about 3:40, and meet their teachers and friends. I lead an opening prayer at 4pm. Dismissal is at 5:30. If you haven't registered yet, call Mrs. Rametta now at the Religious Education Office, at 718 981 2632.
- * Our friendly Sunday morning program for adults who want to join the Catholic Church, or who are already baptized but need the Sacraments of Holy Communion or Confirmation, is about to begin. Come and join us! The program called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or, RCIA, begins next Sunday, Sept. 9. Call the rectory at 718 442 5412 for more information.
- * Our **SAINT TERESA PARISH BENEFIT LUNCHEON** committee members for the Sunday, October 7, 10am Mass in honor of Saint Teresa, and for the Noon to 4pm party that follows at The Staaten on Forest Avenue, have done outstanding work during this summer. Lots of journal ads have been received, and by last Monday we had more than 150 paid reservations! It is likely that many others will be sending in their reservation forms now that we pass Labor Day. And—committee members will be outside Mass next Sunday, September 9, to help people to easily make their reservations and not be disappointed.

God has called all of us to follow him but we are also called to lead. Aiding another's spiritual growth in simple ways can lead others to Christ.

Be on the watch. Ask God to reveal to you those who don't know him. Record their names and commit to praying for them

John 6:60-69, To whom shall we go?

This reading comes at the end of Jesus' Bread of Life Discourse, in which he explained the meaning of the Eucharist. Jesus said that he is the Bread of Life. Unless we eat his flesh and drink his blood, we will not have eternal life. Many of his listeners left, horrified.

The Apostles were also shocked. The day before, enthusiastic crowds were ready to make Jesus king. Now they were running away and Jesus let them go. He understood that the truth is more important than popularity.

Jesus turned to the Apostles and asked if they wanted to leave, too. Peter,

speaking for the group, replied, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). They all recognized Jesus as the source of eternal life. They believed him, even though they didn't fully understand him.

> Followers of Christ know that there is always hope even in times that appear hopeless. We remember Peter's words: "Master...you

have the words of eternal life." With God, we all can have hope. He can bring us eternal life.

Aug. 7 - St. Cajetan (1547). St. Cajetan worked to reform the Church by founding the Theatines, a religious order modeled on the teachings of the

Aug. 11 - St. Clare of Assisi (1253). Born to a noble family in Assisi, Italy, St. Clare followed St. Francis of Assisi into poverty at age eighteen and founded a sister order to the Franciscans called, the "Poor Clares."

Aug. 15 - Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (1950). Declared a dogma of our faith in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, the Assumption celebrates

Mary's being taken up into Heaven body and soul at the end of her life.

Aug. 24 - St. Bartholomew (1st Century). One of the Twelve Apostles and the son of Tolomai, Bartholomew is thought by some scholars to be the Apostle, Nathanael, who went with Philip to see Jesus. After Jesus's ascension, he spread Christianity to India and in Armenia, where he was martyred. He is the patron saint of Armenia and Belgium, among other places.

Q Is it okay to tell a "white lie"?

The Eighth commandment directs us to tell the truth always (Exodus 20:16). While a "white lie" told to avoid hurting



someone else's feelings may seem harmless, telling lies is never acceptable. Here are some suggestions to help:

"Does this look good on me?" A dishonest "yes" creates the wrong impression in the wearer's mind.

Instead of brutal honesty - "You look fat!" - offer a truthful positive - "It's a great color on you." This is "mental reservation," and is better than lying.

"That's personal..." Questions about your personal life, family, and financials don't require explanations, if the seeker has no right to know. A simple, "That's personal," should get the message across. This goes for seeking others' personal information as well (CCC #2489).

Tell the truth with love. What is right and wrong is not decided by popular vote. Admonishing the sinner is actually a spiritual act of mercy. "Whoever fears the Lord directs his friendship aright, for as he is, so his neighbor [will be] also" (Sirach 6:17).
