Dear Parishioners and Friends of Saint Teresa Church,

May you have a happy and peaceful New Year! And let us all praise God our Father, who gives us more time to become more loving and wise, and to help one another in our families—and even strangers we may meet on the side of a road. (Don't miss the true story on page 5 inside.)

I liked very much the Coin In My Pocket and the Prayer Card that registered parishioners received in our November mailing. If you remember, the card had a longer version of the reasons why we Christians contemplate the Cross of our Lord. Let me share those verses with you again as pattern for living in our new Year of Our Lord 2021:

I carry this cross in my pocket / to remind me of who I can be
If I take up my cross and follow / wherever my Savior leads me.
The cross is not there as a token / or a prize I can brag about;
It's there as a personal reminder / of something I can't live without.
It reminds me of Jesus my Savior / Who died for me and now lives;
Each day I remember my new life / and the blessings and gifts He gives.
I carry this cross in my pocket / along with my money and keys.
I keep it close by to remind me / of what's most important to me.
This cross is also a reminder / of the love that I feel in my heart
For all of my fellow believers / a family of which I'm a part.
So I carry a cross to remind me / that along with my family and friends
I take with me the love of Christ Jesus / With Whom I am never alone.

You may have seen the name of our parish in the centerfold of the Nov. 5 issue of **CATHOLIC NEW YORK.** We were being recognized and honored for the faithful generosity of our parishioners who contributed to the **2020 Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal.** 

Presently there are 295 parishes in the Archdiocese of New York, down from 413 after many mergers. Of 295 parishes, only 51 reached their charitable goal to provide money for the support of very poor parishes, Catholic education, diocesan services, and support for retired Sisters, Brothers and priests. Contributors have been very conscious of these needs besides our own parish needs, and we have done exceedingly well with your assistance. I thank you very much for recognizing the needs of others and having a consciousness of sharing and helping one another.

Our goal was \$131,500. The amount pledged as of October 30 was \$146,816. Thank you for that, and for any additional gifts that traditionally come in by January. The need and the opportunity are still there. Our parish will also share benefit substantially from new gifts, for a parish receives 60% of what is received over goal. Our fulfillment rate is excellent. \$142,496 of what was pledged was received at the Archdiocese by October 30. Therefore in November our parish received a rebate check for almost \$6,600. Another smaller check should come in March.

Preparing for the future is a good thing to do at the start of a new year. Making a will while you are of sound mind and clear judgment should be at the top of everyone's list, because a will is a great help to your survivors. Also, making a will allows you to express thanks and provide gifts for institutions like parishes and schools that helped to make you what you are now. Soon I will be announcing two new bequests to our church and our school.

One final thought about helping one another at the time when family or friends begin to suffer loss of memory. A friend who was a hospital chaplain learned these four **Absolutes for Dementia Care** and recommends them as a wonderful way for all of us to act towards others if they have this illness: \* Never argue; instead, agree. \* Never reason; instead divert. \* Never shame; instead, distract. \* Never lecture; instead, reassure.

#### FRIENDS ARE GOD'S WAY OF TAKING CARE OF US

This is a first-person account of an experience that a doctor in Denver had, a few days before Christmas a few years ago.

I just had one of the most amazing experiences of my life. So I want to share it right away with my family and friends.

I was driving home from a meeting this evening about 5pm, stuck in traffic on Colorado Boulevard, when my car suddenly began to sputter and choke, and I was convinced that it was going to die right there on the street.

I spotted a gas station up ahead, and coasted in just before the car came to a dead halt. But at least I was off the road and had a safe place to wait for help.

But before I could make my emergency call, I saw a woman walk out of the Quickie Mart. It looked like she slipped and fell next to a gas pump, so I jumped out to see if she was OK.

When I got to her, it seemed like she had been overcome by sorrow rather than a fall. She was young but looked haggard with dark circles under her eyes. A nickel fell out of her hand, and I picked it up for her.

Suddenly everything came into focus: the crying woman, the ancient Suburban crammed with stuff, three kids in the back, and a gas pump reading \$4.95.

I asked her if she was okay. She just kept repeating that she did not want to let her kids see her crying. We stood on the other side of the pump so the kids could not see us. I listened while she talked, about how she was driving to California, and things were really hard for her right now.

Finally I just asked her if she had been praying. She backed up a little, but I assured her that I was not crazy. And then I told her, "God heard you, and He sent me to help."

I took out my credit card and swiped it through the reader so that she could fill up the tank. While it was fueling I walked to the McDonald's next door and bought a bagful of meals and drinks and gift certificates. She passed the bag to the kids, who attacked it like wolves, while we stood by the pump eating fries and talking.

She told me more of her story. She lived in Kansas City. Her boyfriend left her two months ago, and she could not make ends meet. In desperation she called her parents in California, and talked with them for the first time in five years. They invited her to come home and live with them while she got back on her feet.

So she packed up everything she owned and stuffed it in the car. She told the kids that they were going to California for Christmas – which was true, but the kids didn't know yet that they were going to stay.

She was soon ready to leave. I gave her my gloves and said a prayer for her safety on the road.

As I was walking to my car, she called me and asked a question, "So are you like an angel or something?"

This almost made me cry. But I gave a good answer: "At this time of the year, angels are pretty busy. So sometimes God uses regular people."

It was so incredible to be part of someone else's miracle.

And of course – you guessed it. When I got back in my car, it started right up, and I got all the way home with no trouble.

I'll take it to the mechanic in the morning. But I am pretty sure that he won't find anything wrong.

## CELEBRATE WITH A KING CAKE!



King Cake season goes from the Feast of the Epiphany through Shrove Tuesday (*Mardi Gras*). This round "crown" cake, represents the journey of the 3 kings, and is decorated in purple (*justice*), green (*faith*) and gold (*power*) icing or sugar. Some cakes have a hidden bean or tiny plastic baby hidden inside and the one who finds it is "crowned", or responsible for the next cake.

#### -INGREDIENTS-

1 cup milk (scalded) 1/3 cup butter (melted in milk)

small bow!

1/4 cup warm water 1 package yeast 1 tsp. sugar

small bowl

2 eggs beaten 1/2 cup sugar pinch salt

small bowl

Let all ingredients sit about 15 minutes, add to flour - mix well

4 cups flour

large bowl

-DIRECTIONS-



Knead on floured surface, 10 minutes (add more flour if needed). Rub dough ball with vegetable oil and place in covered oiled bowl in warm place to rise, 1 hour or double in size. Roll flat into rectangle and brush on oil or melted butter, sprinkle with sugar cinnamon. Roll into log starting on long edge. Form into ring (crown), pinch edges together and let rise on baking tray. Bake 350° for 15 - 20 minutes or until golden brown.

**Colored sugar:** In a jar add 1/2 cup sugar, 1-2 drops food color... green or yellow or red/blue (purple) and shake well. Decorate with green, purple & yellow (gold) cake icing and colored sugar. This cake does not include a bean or baby, as in some traditions, due to choking hazard.




