

One of my pastors used to say, "Sunday isn't Sunday without the two Ms: Mass and Macaroni." That second M may not be as universal a custom today, but Catholics will always need the divine wisdom, the Holy Communion, and the fellowship we gain when we are together for Sunday Mass. So please prioritize, be at Mass, and bring your families and friends with you. And if you have a child ages 4 to 8, I am delighted to announce that we will resume our popular CHILDRENS LITURGY OF THE WORD during the 10:30 Mass, beginning in two weeks. Please see the announcement on the top of the next page.

Next Sunday, September 11, will be our annual commemoration of the lives lost at the World Trade Center. After each Mass in church, we will have prayers and the reading of parishioners' names at our 9/11 Memorial near the Cross and flagpole. And if you can participate this Friday night Sept. 9 at the annual Staten Island-wide Mass for the 9/11 victims and their families, join me at Our Lady of Pity Church, 1616 Richmond Avenue, just off Victory Blvd, for a 7:30pm Mass led by Bishop John O'Hara.

Every September we are especially inviting people who want to catch up on their Sacraments. Many adults missed out on special events in their younger lives, usually because of circumstances out of their control, leaving them without the advantage and divine assistance that comes with the Sacraments of our Catholic Church. This is also a reminder for all parents, grandparents and godparents, to ask and be sure that every child in our families is getting a **religious** education this year.

Sacraments are outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace. God's grace can now help people who were baptized but not confirmed or introduced to Holy Communion, or who have never made a good confession, or who did not ask for God's blessing on their marriage, to feel much better about themselves and to be closer to Jesus Christ our Good Shepherd.

Since September is a time for new starts and for finishing things you want to do: seize the day! If you need a sacrament, we want to help you. Please contact me at 718 442 5412, or Father John or Deacon Jonathan when you see any of us at Mass. Our parish is soon starting Sunday morning meetings after the 10:30 Mass. Speaking up now will get you ready to celebrate at Easter any of the sacraments of initiation - Baptism, Holy Communion, or Confirmation—that you are missing. Mrs. Macrina Reyes and other adult volunteers will help you to enjoy God's graces and succeed with the challenges of your life.

A few weeks ago during August we had the annual feast-day of Saint Lawrence the Martyr, a Deacon of Rome. I would like to remind you of his story, because Deacon Lawrence is one of our bravest saints. He was martyred in a gruesome way for his faith in Jesus Christ and for his service to the poor people of the Church. This torture was done in Rome almost 1800 years ago, on August 10, 258, by the Roman Emperor Valerian.

Saint Lawrence was born in Spain around the year 225. As young Christian, after his studies in Zaragoza, Spain, he went to Rome. There he was ordained a deacon – who is someone who provides service and leadership for our community, who helps his bishop or priest during Mass, and helps the needy on behalf of the Church. Pope Sixtus II made Lawrence his Archdeacon – his right-hand man – at a time when the Emperor Valerian's greed and his hatred for Christians got worse and worse.

As Archdeacon, Lawrence was responsible for collecting and distributing money to feed the many poor people of Rome. After arresting other deacons and even executing Pope Sixtus, the Emperor Valerian planned to confiscate (a polite word for steal) whatever valuable possessions people had given to God and the Church. Accordingly, Valerian arrested Archdeacon Lawrence, brought him in, and demanded that Lawrence turn over all the treasures of the Church. Then Lawrence would be set free and save his own life. Lawrence pretended to accept. But he asked that he be given three days to get everything together.

On the third day, Lawrence came to the Emperor's palace as he had promised. But instead of all the gold and silver treasures that the Emperor was expecting, Lawrence brought with him many people - the poor, the sick, the old, the beggars. And Lawrence--who had secretly sold everything that the church had, and given all that money away – Deacon Lawrence stood in front of the Emperor and told him that these people were the treasures of the Church.

Infuriated and humiliated, the Emperor ordered that Lawrence be beaten, tied by chains on a gridiron, and slowly be grilled to death over a fire. It is reported that Lawrence endured this torture by fire very bravely, and even had the courage and humor to say to the men stoking the fire: "You can turn me over now; this side is done."

There is a lot to think about in this true story. And if you get to visit Saint Patrick's Cathedral, look for the awesome stained-glass window that shows Saint Lawrence being grilled on a fire and becoming a martyr for the treasures of the Church.

Doors open at 12:30, and we go home by 3:30.



The most important thing

When Jesus promised to be with us always, He wasn't just talking symbolically. He meant that He would stay with us -Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. In fact, when we go to Mass, we meet Jesus, Himself, "truly, really, and substantially contained" in Holy Communion (Catechism of the Catholic Church, # 1374). Don't miss a single Sunday Mass. He is there every time.

Our "Call"

When God calls, He asks that His children respond. Throughout history, when the Father called a chosen people, prophets, and kings to service, they responded. Jesus called His apostles and disciples. They responded. God calls each of us. Have you responded? Are you where He wants you to be?

Four tools for spreading the Good News

Before He ascended, Jesus told His disciples, "Go...make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). We are all called to preach the Gospel,

sometimes by words, but always by the holiness of our lives. Jesus gave us four must-haves for this task:

Peace: The confidence that all things, even our greatest sufferings, will be for our good is peace. Living a Gospel-centered life brings peace and sets us apart in what we choose: music, recreation, dress. These choices are counter-cultural and testify to our faith. Be at peace: our security is in the Truth, not others' opinions of us.

Simplicity: We can't give what we

don't have. To give Christ to others, we must make room for Him in our own hearts. For example, buy only what's necessary and limit time on social

media. Frequent the Sacraments and Mass. Pray daily.

Charity: Jesus uses us to communicate His love to others. In addition to acts of mercy for the poor, charity requires treating others with dignity, respect, patience, and kindness – even when it's challenging.

Joy: We experience joy when we receive God's love. This means keeping our hearts open to accepting the Good News, not giving into bitterness and resentment, reminding ourselves of the ways God has shown His love for us. Don't keep it to yourself. Tell others.



Why do some churches have altar rails?

Altar rails, or "Communion rails," located between the sanctuary and the front pews, helped facilitate the Communion distribution when everyone received Communion on the tongue while kneeling. The rails

kneeling. The rails encouraged the faithful to be reverent before the Face of God – literally. Called, "the people's altar," the rails were also where communicants offered their spiritual sacrifices to God directly as they received Him. We can do this without rails, but kneeling for Communion is a

powerful reminder of Who we are receiving.
