

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Saint Teresa Parish,

The image we have of Saint Francis of Assisi — lover of animals, gentle beggar, writer of a prayer that begins "Lord, make me a channel of your peace"— does not include the sickness called PTSD. Yet in fact St. Francis leaves lots of evidence of his suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder, resulting from his time as a soldier and prisoner.

The first stop on our St. Teresa Church Pilgrimage to Italy (April 20-28, 2023; www.petersway.com) will be Assisi, the beautiful hilltop home of this great saint. Outside the magnificent Basilica with its own awesome spaces and many vivid images of Francis' life, is a larger-than-life work of art, all alone on a lawn. It shows Francis in full military armor, slumped on his armored horse, his head hanging down as if in deep sorrow.

An article in the <u>St. Anthony Messenger</u> magazine of last November tells this story with the help of a Franciscan priest who served as a chaplain in the Marine Corps for 22 years, and who now leads pilgrimages of healing.

"Long before St. Francis would hear the voice of Christ and renounce wealth for a life of poverty, he lived the privileged life of a young aristocrat. When war broke out between Assisi and the neighboring city of Perugia, he eagerly signed up...Rushing into battle without any training, Francis was captured. Those from Assisi were vastly outnumbered, and were slaughtered in a crushing defeat. Many prisoners were immediately put to death, but the men of Perugia realized that this young aristocrat might bring a ransom, and so they threw him into prison.

Francis was held in miserable conditions for a year. Eventually his father paid for his freedom. Some analysts of his writings say that long after his release and conversion, Francis still suffered from PTSD. Fr. Conrad Targonski, OFM, the Marine chaplain mentioned above, explains: "In some of the writings, he is with the brothers, and wakes up yelling in the middle of the night, feeling rats crawling all over him."

This is not a nightmare you would expect from the patron saint of animals, but it is one that military veterans can relate to. And it has helped Father Targonski through his own struggles with PTSD. During one of his tours in Iraq, he was the only Catholic priest at the Battle of Fallujah in 2004. He remembers running through the streets from unit to unit, ministering to others, being bored for a few minutes, and in utter terror five seconds later.

In battle he carried with him a small replica of the famous Cross of San Damiano, the image of Jesus which inspired Francis to change his life completely. Back in Assisi after his misadventures in war, while praying before that crucifix, Francis heard the voice of Christ, which told him to "rebuild my church." He responded by trying to sell his father's goods to pay for the work that was needed. But rebuked by both his father and the local bishop, he renounced his birthright, embraced poverty and returned everything he had to his father, even the clothes on his back.

But what was it about that dirty cross, hanging in a crumbling church, that caused such a radical change in Francis? Father Targonski thinks he has an answer: the three military people on the icon. (By all means, find and hold your own San Damiano cross if you have one, or look for it in a prayerbook, or Google it so you can see it.)

Under the outstretched arms of the crucified Christ are five people. They are witnesses described in the Bible. One is Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Another is Saint John, the Beloved Disciple. At the far right is the Roman centurion who has been stationed to guard the prisoner. His hand is raised as if he is just uttering his all-important profession of faith: "Truly this was the Son of God!"

Below them are two smaller figures: the soldier who pierced the side of Christ with a lance, and the soldier who offered Jesus a sponge soaked in vinegar. These military men, all turned towards the crucified Christ, may have shown the war-weary veteran where he should turn to find healing.

But back to that slumping Francis outside the Basilica. The dejected figure on a horse is Francis coming home to Assisi without a victory after going to the Crusades. Like a wounded soldier signing up for a second tour of duty, still angry about his imprisonment, possibly trying to redeem himself, Francis had volunteered to fight in the Crusade. But before reaching battle, this would-be crusader heard the voice of Christ, stopping him from proceeding. When Francis asked God what he should do, God answered: "Go back home. It will be revealed to you."

So what we might see in that statue as exhaustion is also bad memories, discouragement and fear about what people at home will think of him. But instead of withdrawing, Francis decides to embrace others. Outside Assisi, he comes upon a leper—an outcast, contagious, sick and horribly disfigured by his illness, shunned by everyone. Francis finds his purpose. He embraces the man and kisses him in brotherly love. He understands that God can use someone's own darkest experiences to bless those around him."




