

Thank you to everyone who offered good wishes and prayers for the 22 of us on our April 20-28 parish pilgrimage. We went to Italian cities and churches associated with awesome saints: the apostles Saint Peter and Saint Paul who died as martyrs outside the walls of Rome; Saint Francis and Saint Clare, both of Assisi, who became the charismatic founders of religious orders; Saint Pius of Pietrelcina, the holy man of San Giovanni Rotondo church, known and loved as Padre Pio, who bore the *stigmata*—that is, bloody signs of Jesus' suffering on his hands and feet and side. We were all happy for our pilgrimage experiences of faith and friendship. It also helped that no one can get a bad meal in Italy!

One place that we chose to visit was smaller and more remote than the famous urban shrines and churches that everybody knows about. On our Sunday in Italy, we went to the small town and the parish church of Manoppello. Why? Because there is growing belief, especially heightened by a personal visit in September of 2006 by Pope Benedict XVI, that in that church in Manoppello, in Abruzzo, near Pescara, is a true image of the face of Jesus.

I read in a book titled *The Holy Face: From Manoppello to the World*, by Antonio Bini, that the sacred object on display on the altar in that parish church is called a *sudarium*. A *sudarium* is a veil or handkerchief that was used by Jewish people to cover the face of a dead person at the time of burial. There is no certainty or official church declaration up to now about how this veil - if it is a true image of Jesus' Holy Face - got from Jerusalem to Rome, and then for the last five hundred years has been hidden in such a obscure place.

However, as the book says, while the historical origins of the Veil are largely anecdotal, years of scientific study and historical research report the Veil as having these very significant attributes:

- 1. The faces on the more famous Shroud of Turin and the face on the Manoppello Veil coincide perfectly. In the museum room next to the church, we could study and compare very large images of the faces on the Shroud and on the Veil. When the images of the faces were placed over one another, the size and shape were almost identical.
 - 2. Both images are technically acheiropoietas—meaning they could not have been made by human hands.
 - 3. The Veil—measuring a mere 7 by 10 inches—is dated in the time of the Lord's Crucifixion and Resurrection.
- 4. The Shroud of Turin shows the image of a man with closed eyes and fresh wounds. The Veil of Manoppello shows a face with open eyes and closed wounds.

As visitors in the chapel, I was given a special chasuble (the outside vestment I wear at Mass) with an image on it of the Holy Face of Jesus. We purchased one of those vestments, and brought it home to wear in our church. We priests will wear this chasuble with the image of Jesus' Holy Face at each of our Masses next Sunday. I wanted to tell you about this first, and then wear it so that you can see the image of Jesus for yourself. I hope you will be intrigued and inspired to wonder if in fact it really is a **vero nike**—a true image— of the face of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ.

The rainy weather of last weekend yielded to a bright sunny Monday—and already the new month of May! May 1 is the feastday of Saint Joseph the Worker, a celebration of the dignity and rights of all people who work for a living.

Speaking of Mass, please make a note to yourself that the **Feast of the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ** into Heaven is coming soon, in about ten days: <u>on Thursday May 18</u>. We start with a Mass on Wednesday afternoon at 4pm. Then on Ascension Thursday, we have three Masses for all—at 8:30am, 12 Noon, and 7:30pm—and one Mass just for our St. Teresa-St. Rita school community.

Finally, I want to invite you to read again the information inside about the celebration events on Sunday June 25 for our one hundred years of community and worship at what is now Saint Nicholas Chapel. See how to participate in the lottery for Mass seating if you want to be there at 3pm. And whether you can attend the Mass or not, treat yourself to a fine meal and good conversation at the 5pm gala dinner at the Staaten Restaurant that afternoon.
