

During this month our parish had the honor of a happy visit from Cardinal Timothy Dolan. Three years ago he was scheduled to come for a ribbon-cutting of our completely rebuilt former convent at 139 Windsor Road. It is now known as ARCHCARE AT SAINT TERESA. But Covid intervened. In some ways his visit on May 10 was sweeter and more satisfying, because the ten residents-eight people with autism, a site manager and another person-are very happy with their three years of independent living in their own apartments, with their friendships and accomplishments. This new concept was initiated by Cardinal Dolan, and created by our Archdiocese's ARCHCARE. It is a first-of-its-kind arrangement in New York State, and all of us here were part of making it happen. It is a wonderful success, a model that literally hundreds of families with autistic young adults wish they could get into today. May the second ARCHCARE project, now underway in Tuckahoe, in Westchester County, become a blessing there.

Then His Eminence, with ARCHCARE CEO Scott LaRue, went up to a new ARCHCARE partner: Eger Health Care and Rehabilitation Center. Eger has a wonderful Lutheran heritage, and preserving its Christian ministry to help the sick was a priority for their Board. Eger was founded about 110 years ago in Brooklyn. Its purpose was to care for "Norwegian persons of respectability and in reduced circumstances, not under 65 years of age." More than 150 people, including many residents, staff, and public officials, joined in a prayer service in their beautiful chapel.

Eger's President Lorri Senk said in her welcoming remarks that the providential partnership between Eger and ARCHCARE, which began last year, gave Eger "a second chance at life." Cardinal Dolan responded in his talk that, "When people talk about Eger, they talk about their holistic care. Not just the body, not just the heart. They also care for the soul. This magnificent chapel makes people say: this place has got its priorities right."

Also with priorities right was the daughter of a doctor who became one of greatest educators in the history of our country: Saint Elizabeth Bailey Seton, native of Staten Island, foundress of the Sisters of Charity in the United States. Mrs. Seton faced the financial and moral necessity of educating her own five children after the financial ruin of her husband's import business, his sickness and death in Italy, and the social disapproval and financial calamity for her family when she became a Roman Catholic. She lived from 1774 to 1821. She was baptized in Saint Andrew's Episcopal Church on Snake Hill Road. In her late teens she married importer-exporter William Seton. They lived at 8 State Street in Manhattan, in a building across from the present terminal for the Staten Island Ferry.

Memorial Day weekend always falls between Mother's Day and Father's Day. It is never too late for children of any age to appreciate their parents and to add words of thanks or praise for the love and good example they gave. In that light, let me quote part of a Mother's Day greeting sent last weekend from the Sisters of Charity of Mt. St. Vincent, in the Riverdale section of the Bronx. (These are the Sisters who began the hospital that is today RUMC.)

Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton was no ordinary woman. Her love of God, her commitment to the Catholic Church, and her desire to follow God's will, whatever the cost, were all extraordinary. Yet, at the same time, her letters reveal that as a mother, she experienced ordinary joys and ordinary struggles.

In just eight years' time, Elizabeth brought five children into the world: two boys (Richard and William) and three girls (Anna Maria, Catherine, and Rebecca). She adored them all. "My darlings are too precious, too lovely, and their mother too happy," she wrote in a letter to one friend. She never attempted to hide her affection. "Mamma longs to kiss you and hold you in her arms," she wrote to five-year-old Richard upon departure for Italy.

At the same time, Elizabeth wasn't immune to the daily trials of mothering. "My children talk so fast, they confuse my brain," she confided in one letter. She also fretted about her "saucy boys" who "almost master me" and she anxiously sought advice from a friend about Anna Maria's stubborn will and bad temper, declaring that her daughter "despite all my endeavors is past my management."

As the years passed, however, nothing concerned Elizabeth as much as her children's relationship with God and the state of their souls. During the months leading up to her conversion to Catholicism, what concerned her most was the children. "I must answer for my children in judgment, whatever faith I lead them to," she explained. After her conversion, she delighted in her three daughters ready acceptance of the Catholic faith, but feared for her sons, whose friends mocked the Church. In order to protect them from bad influences, she sent them off to Georgetown University, one of the only two Catholic boarding schools for boys in the United States at the time.

As much as Elizabeth wanted to shepherd her children into heaven, she also recognized as they grew that they had their own path to walk, and that the blows that life dealt them were a necessary part of their journey.

For mothers and fathers today, seeking to raise faithful children in a not so faith-filled world, Elizabeth is both a model to follow and a spiritual mother to whom parents can turn and pray. Her affection, her gentleness, her desire to provide for her children and to help them grow in holiness is what God asks of every parent, every day.

Take good care of yourself. You belong to God.

Taking care of ourselves can become a low priority in the midst of other obligations. Yet caring for our bodies and minds is a duty we have to God. He needs us strong and healthy so we can help build up His kingdom.

Body: What you put into your body is even more important than what you put on it. Take steps to make your diet healthier and more nourishing. Avoid drugs or excessive alcohol. Doctors urge daily exercise and eight hours of sleep each night.

Mind: Become picky about what you feed your mind, too. What you watch, read, and listen to influences the way you look at the world. Evidence shows that it's hard to regularly watch violent shows or movies and still be a calm and happy person. Programs or movies that portray infidelity or promiscuity as acceptable behaviors eventually dull our sense of sin. Feed your mind positive, Gospel-centered images that will build you up and inspire you. Surround yourself with people who do the same.

from Scripture

John 20:19-23, "Receive the Holy Spirit"

This Gospel passage gives us a glimpse of how the apostles spent their first Easter Sunday – hiding in a locked room. They were terrified the Romans would find them and execute them. To their surprise and great relief, Jesus appeared to them in glory and spoke words of peace. He showed them His glorious wounds as "living proof" of His Resurrection.

Then Jesus gave them a mission: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" establishing the Sacrament of Penance (John 20:23). He gave them the Holy Spirit, anticipating the feast of

Pentecost. Now, having authority to forgive sins, the apostles and their successors could continue

Jesus' work after He returned to heaven.
Jesus' appearance to His apostles reveals the fullness of God's mercy. He also sent the Holy Spirit to them. He descended powerfully on Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. That same
Spirit is gifted to us in Baptism

and dwells in our souls. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal God's love to you and help you become more like Christ each day.

Feasts & 🗕 💿 Celebrations

May 3 – Sts. Philip and James (1st Century). St. Philip was born in Bethsaida and followed John the Baptist before he followed Christ. After the Ascension, St. Philip preached in Asia Minor, where he was martyred. St. James, son of Alphaeus, was also one of the twelve Apostles.

May 10 - St. John of Ávila (1569). Born to wealthy, pious parents, St. John left a budding career as a lawyer to become a priest. At the request of his bishop, he worked and preached to renew the faith of Catholics in Andalusia.

May 18 – Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord (1st Century). This solemnity marks the completion of Jesus' mission of salvation and His triumphant entry into heaven. Note: In many dioceses, observance of Ascension has been moved to the following Sunday.

May 25 – St. Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi (1607). Born to a distinguished Florentine family,

What is the meaning of the Miraculous Medal?

The Miraculous Medal, given to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830, was designed by the Blessed Mother to teach us three things:

Mary prays for us: The medal's front reads: O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee. We don't



pray to her; she prays for us! Of course, we can go directly to Jesus anytime. In fact, Mary's role is to bring us to Jesus as swiftly and safely as possible. Evil can be

defeated: Mary is

shown crushing Satan's head, recalling the prophecy of his defeat (Genesis 3:15). Mary's humble "yes" to God paved the way for Christ's victory over death, sin, and evil. When we give God our "yes," then Christ's victory bears fruit in our lives.

Grace is always available: St.
Catherine asked why only some of the gemstones in Mary's rings radiated light. Her answer? The dim gems symbolize "the graces for which souls forget to ask." God's grace is always available to us. All we have to do is ask.


