

Summertime can be a good opportunity for parishioners to consider coming to Mass one or more times during the week. Our Pope and Bishops are especially encouraging people to have a "Eucharistic Revival" - and a good way to do that with new joy and appreciation for Jesus is by receiving Our Lord in Holy Communion on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday, as well as every Sunday.

Those of us who come to weekday Masses—our parish offers Masses every Monday to Saturday at 8:30am and also on Tuesday to Friday at 12 Noon— have additional valuable time to offer prayers for people we love, to find out more about parts of the Bible we never knew were in there, and also to learn about very interesting men and women who are officially called Saints. For example, here are four Saints that we celebrate in July:

* Saint Augustine Zhao Rong (feastday July 9). China was very suspicious of and closed to other influences in the late 1700s. When French missionary Bishop Gabriel Taurin-Defrasse went there to preach about Jesus, he was arrested and condemned to death. One of the soldiers assigned to guard him and bring him to Beijing for his execution was so impressed by the Bishop's courage and faith in Jesus that this soldier asked to be baptized. Later he was chosen for ordination as a Catholic priest. In 1815 former soldier Augustine Zheo Rong was the first Chinese-born Catholic priest to be put to death as a martyr. Courageous conversion to Catholicism and perseverance despite persecution of Saint Augustine Zhao Rong and hundreds of other Chinese martyrs during the 1800s reminds us to pray today for the many Catholic Chinese people whose sufferings remain hidden under the oppressive tactics and hostile-to-religion policies of the present Chinese government.

* Saint Camillus de Lellis, whose feastday was last Tuesday July 18, had a very adventurous life. Six foot six and physically impressive, he was a soldier who fought for pay with various armies in Italy. He was also a big gambling addict who lost all his money. Needing work, he found a construction job at a Franciscan Capuchin monastery, and was won over by the example of the monks he met. Too old to join their order, and inspired to find his own way to serve God's people, he decided to start a religious order that was dedicated to caring for the sick. That Order—known as the Camillians—continues today. And Saint Camillus' story of changing his life and giving up gambling helps people today. A priest I knew was the chaplain in a high-security prison near me in Dutchess County. This priest was very effective with the staff and the inmates. He even succeeded in getting the warden to give him precious space in the prison for an interfaith chapel. Inmates decorated it with original religious art, and they named for this gambler who reformed and rebuilt his life: Saint Camillus de Lellis.

* Talk about somebody with a bad reputation! <u>Saint Mary Magdalene</u> (feastday yesterday) has been mistakenly gossiped about as a fallen woman for centuries. About her life before she met Jesus: all we really know is that Jesus cast seven demons out of her. That means that she had been sick in her mind, and probably acted out in a scary way—and Jesus cured her. Was she also the fallen woman in the Gospel of Luke 7:36ff. who wormed her way into a dinner in someone else's house and was so sorry for her sins that she cried over Jesus' feet and scandalously dried his feet with her hair? Most scholars today say no, it is not the same one. What we do know is this: Mary Magdalene was a loyal follower of Jesus Christ, and was there with Jesus on the day of his crucifixion. Not only was she there for his burial on Friday afternoon—Saint Mark identifies her as among the first to discover the empty tomb on Easter morning. She became an "Apostle to the Apostles" by running to tell Peter and John this amazing news. But they did not believe her, and ran to see for themselves.

* <u>Saint Ignatius of Loyola</u> (July 31) was another soldier with no respect for God, who needed to be taken down a peg—and was by a cannonball! Stuck in bed to recover, he began to read about Jesus and the lives of saints, and he had a conversion of heart. The result of God's mercy to him is a worldwide religious community of priests and brothers engaged in teaching and missionary work. We call them "Jesuits" - with the official name of: Society of Jesus. And let us not forget the most famous Jesuit in the world. He lives in Rome, wears a white cassock, and is the Successor of Saint Peter. If anyone needs another clue: he always ends his messages and meetings by asking everybody to do this one thing: "Please pray for me!" So now, so do I.




