Dear Parishioners and Friends of Saint Teresa Church,

This Friday is the holyday of obligation for the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will have a 4pm Mass on Thursday, and three Masses on Friday at 8:30, 12 Noon, and 7:30pm. Please come if you are able. And to answer the next holyday question: what time will be the Masses for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day?

We have two obligations. For Sunday December 24, we will have Masses at 4pm Saturday, 7:30am, 9am (St. Nicholas), 10:30, and 12:30. There is no 5pm Mass for Sunday, because Christmas Masses have begun by then. On Sunday we have Christmas Masses—one in church, one in chapel—at 4pm. Then a 9pm Mass in church, preceded by Christmas hymns from 8:30pm. On Monday, Christmas, we have four Masses, at 7:30am, 9am in St. Nicholas Chapel, 10:30, and last at 12:30pm.

Perhaps you already know that this Christmas will be the 800th anniversary of the first Christmas Nativity scene. And that the person who started this wonderful spiritual custom for our homes and churches is the great Saint Francis of Assisi.

In his honor, this year the nativity scene in St. Peter's Square will focus on Francis' first "live nativity," that he created in 1223 for the people in the little Italian town of Greccio.

The Vatican's Christmas tree will be a silver fir tree from the Alps, from the municipality of Macra in the Piedmontese diocese of Saluzzo in northern Italy. The Christmas tree illumination and surrounding decorations, like our own lighting next Saturday after the 4pm Mass, will be on December 9, and will remain on display until January 7 of 2024.

1223 turned out to be an historic year, not just for the first nativity scene. That same year, Pope Honorius III approved the governing document called the Franciscan Rule, for the new community of the Friars Minor. To celebrate this double anniversary, the Vatican's nativity scene will be decorated with a Franciscan flair, recalling Francis' Greccio nativity scene.

The crib in the center of St. Peter's Square will invite visitors back to Christmas in 1223. It will be inspired by Franciscan writer Tommaso da Celano's account of what happened after St. Francis returned safely from a trip to the Holy Land. Yes, Francis went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in a time of danger! And he tried to bring peace to the people fighting there. Upon his return, he wanted to commemorate the birth of Christ in an Italian village that reminded him of Bethlehem. This was Greccio, a small town in the Rieti valley in central Italy, 700 meters above sea level.

So the Vatican's nativity scene and its life-size terracotta figures will represent that Greccio grotto, which Pope Francis visited in 2019. The crib will feature a Franciscan figure celebrating Mass in the presence of St. Francis carrying Baby Jesus and the Virgin Mary. Next to him will be St. Joseph in adoration, as well as a donkey and an ox.

The structure of this nativity scene will be set on an octagonal base symbolizing the 800th anniversary of this event. Around it, a basin will represent the river that runs through the valley. The work, designed by artist Francesco Artese, will also feature links to four Franciscan sanctuaries and the town of Rieti.

The Vatican's Paul VI Audience Hall, where the Pope presides over general audiences in the winter, will also have its own crib from Rieti, which will be fashioned from thousands of tesserae of Venetian glass. In addition to the Holy Family, St. Francis, and St. Clare will be part of this scene created by famous mosaicist Alessandro Serena di Spilimbergo.

We just had the excitement and lots of publicity about the choice, arrival, decoration, and lighting of the huge Rockefeller Center Christmas Tree, just a block from Saint Patrick's Cathedral. (Be sure to come into the Cathedral for a prayer and to see the very large manger scene with beautiful images of the Holy Family, and of various animals and even a full size camel!) In Rome at the Vatican, St. Peter's central outdoor Christmas tree was also carefully chosen. It comes from the province of Cuneo. Standing 82 feet high, it was selected from the upper Maira Valley, named after the river that flows through this forested Alpine region.

The small community of mountain parishioners who live in the area are very committed to preserving their traditions, and they had the idea to donate one of their trees to the Vatican. In an ecological spirit, the tree will be adorned with thousands of edelweiss flowers typical of their valley, and are able to grow in the wild at a high altitude. The inauguration of the nativity scene and the lighting of the Vatican Christmas tree will take place at 5 pm on Saturday, December 9. Delegations from Rieti and Macra will meet Pope Francis in an audience earlier the same day. The Pontiff traditionally comes in person to visit the nativity scene in St. Peter's Square on December 31, after the last Vesper Prayers of the year.

Pilgrims and tourists coming to Rome for end-of-year celebrations will be able to admire the Vatican decorations until January 7, 2024. That is the feast of Christ's baptism, which marks the end of the liturgical Christmas season. The crib will then be put on permanent display in the town of Rieti. Thanks to them all—and to people near us who light up their homes at Christmas, and thus make their faith and hope in Jesus well known.

By instructing your IRA custodian to make a distribution directly to St. Teresa Church or to another charitable organization DIRECTLY from your account, you can gain more tax benefits than if you withdraw the money and then make your gift.

Further: in some cases, charitable distributions from your IRA may lower your Adjusted Gross Income. This in turn may also lower Medicare and other payments that are calculated from your Adjusted Gross Income.

Direct charitable IRA distribution is valuable and so easy to do. By giving directly—if you do not “touch” the money—you can make a bigger difference for your favorite charities, and for you.

So if you are fortunate to have saved in an IRA and are over 72 years of age, remember that you are required by law to take a required minimum distribution before December 31 every year. Failure triggers a financial penalty and an avoidable loss.

If you wish, please direct at least some of that required minimum distribution to help our Saint Teresa Parish so we can continue and improve our good works of worship, education, and charitable services for our community.



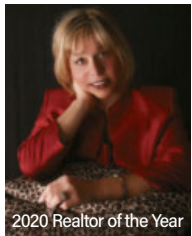
