One of the exciting things we did as soon as we settled in our new home was exploring the entire neighborhood. It was lot of fun and we did it with great excitement and reported to mom about everything we saw and did. I am here already one year in this neighborhood. I think, I getting old that I do not show the same type of excitement in exploring the neighborhood. My mind does more exploring than my body. When I drive through Route 82, I see so many roads branching out from it with strange names. The questions that arise in my mind as I read the street names, is this leading to one house or a cluster of houses? Are the houses Catholic homes? When will I get a chance to visit them? Maybe, our Cardinal thinks that I have known all the parishioners and their homes by now. Though I desire to visit people and homes, let him know that I am only moving in snail's speed. God help me.


