My Dear Parishioners,

These winter days of cold and rain, wind and ice continue and I find myself most reluctant to go outdoors. **BUT, I do** have that option. If there is a good reason, I can put on my coat and hat, get in the car, and off I go. Whether I am to celebrate Mass or want some quiet time with the Lord before the tabernacle, it's a 30-second trip even with weather at its worst. This past weekend's icy rain reduced attendance at the Masses considerably and reminded me that our parish family has more than a few members who do not have such a choice. Some are completely homebound while others find their comings and goings restricted by the weather.

It is here that our Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist play a vital role. In Holy Communion to the homebound coping with the frustrating aches and pains of aging as well as to those parishioners recovering from illness or surgery, they remind them that they belong to Christ and a community of faith.

Although the care of the sick is an essential task in every parish's life, it cannot be completed without **you**. Even though I note an empty space in a pew on Sunday, or miss a familiar face, **you** must tell us before a sick person can receive Holy Communion and the consolation of regular contact with the faith community is restored. We Christians are a people of compassion for our sick, who reach out in tenderness to listen, to pray with, to strengthen, and to minister. Your job is to "start the ball rolling". Call the Parish Office if one of our parish family would like to receive Communion. You live out the best of our tradition when you arrange for this spiritual care.

Feeding Our Neighbors Campaign


