SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

Some men informed the Gentiles that they must be circumcised if they wished to be saved, because of the Old Laws. Disciples then went forth to tell the Gentiles to honor only those rules which were strictly necessary, such as abstaining from eating meat sacrificed to idols and illicit sexual union.

Second Reading: Revelations 21:10-14, 22-23

John depicts Jerusalem coming out of heaven, sparkling with the radiance of precious jewels. Angels were stationed at each of its twelve gates, and each gate bore the name of one tribe of Israel. The city had no temple, because God was its temple. The glory and light of God and the Lamb also replaced their need for the sun.

Gospel: John 14:23-29

Jesus tells his disciples, "Anyone who loves me will be true to my word." For those who do honor his word, both Jesus and God will love them and stay with them always. He also tells them that God will send the Holy Spirit in his place to give them the instructions they will need. Jesus then tells them that peace is his farewell gift to them.

From the Pastor's Desk ...

Today's readings show us the effects of the abiding presence of God in His Church and of His indwelling in each one of us. The first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, tells us how the Holy Spirit, indwelling in the Church, helped the apostles to solve a major doctrinal problem about the Gentiles becoming Christians, which shook the very foundation of the early Church. The Gospel passage reminds us that the Holy Spirit, abiding within us, is our Teacher, Advocate and the Source of peace and joy. The passage offers a vision of hope as well.

Jesus promises his followers that the Holy Spirit will come and instruct them in everything they need to know.

This past week at the pastoral council we discussed the feast of Corpus Christi. The mass schedule just for that Sunday: 7:30 am, 9:00 am, and 11:00 am. Since Cardinal Dolan, our shepherd and spiritual leader will be here, we are not able to have Sunday June 23 morning mass at Our Lady of Lourdes.

Join us on this feast day for our 11:00 am Mass, Eucharistic procession, and reception. We are truly blessed that Cardinal Dolan will be here, present to lead our Eucharistic celebration for this most important feast of the Blessed Sacrament. I hope all of you and your families will join us as you are able!

The feast of Corpus Christi, to Catholics, is the greatest of all feast days besides Christmas and Easter, and the Eucharistic procession that usually takes place after Mass is one of the highlights of the year. During the procession we feel so blessed to be Catholic, and to have the opportunity to adore Christ in the monstrance, outside for all to see. In the history when the Eucharistic procession goes through a town or neighborhood, then the priest can actually take Christ into the community and the people in the procession can give witness to their faith in the Real Presence—and hopefully stir up curiosity in the minds and hearts of the people who see the procession go by.

Let us all participate as a parish family with our shepherd, Cardinal Dolan to show our love for our Eucharistic Lord. May our procession also bring joy to all who participate! This is not an unfounded joy, but one founded on the knowledge that Christ comes to us, to be among us, to make His dwelling in our midst, to teach us, and lead us to the Father! Please join us!


