

From Cardinal's Dolan...

July 4, 2021

Dear friends in the Lord:

Currently serving happily as president of the board of directors of the *Black and Indian Mission Office*, I write to you today to offer thanks for last year's support of \$149,000, and to ask for your generosity again as we prepare to collect an offering on Sunday, July 11 for the *Catholic Missions among Black and Indian People*. Established as the first national collection in 1874, it has proven itself to be a successful vehicle to provide for the needs of our African American, Native American and Alaska Native brothers and sisters.




A Summer Blessing


