

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

From the Pastor's Desk ...

2nd Sunday of Lent—Transfiguration Sunday

As we journey with our Lord with Peter, James and John to Mount Tabor this Sunday, which is also known as Transfiguration Sunday, we reflect on another one of God's marvels- seeing Christ in His divinity. As we heard the voice of God the Father at the Baptism of the Lord, we, once again hear God's voice and exclaim, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him." Our Lord is before the apostles Peter, James and John and behold HE is "transfigured" or changed in front of them. His appearance is now in all of the glory of God. At first, Christ is seen talking with Moses and Elijah. Then, all of a sudden, our Lord is by Himself, His garments became as light, as the gospel tells us. Then we hear God's voice. What meaning does the Transfiguration have for you and for me?

Trans means to change. The very figure of the person of Christ changed before the eyes of the Apostles who were chosen to witness this miraculous event. The meaning of Transfiguration Sunday is for all of us to transform our lives to that of Christ. At baptism, we become a new creation and have been placed on our shoulders the mantle of Christ as St. Paul relates. Our lives, my brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus are to manifest/ show the presence of Christ to the world. When we allow God into our lives and become humble servants, we become true disciples of Christ and the world begins to become a better place in which to live. Thus, we change our life, conform our life to God's. This is what the Season of Lent does for us It helps us and reveals to us what our life should and can be with God.

When the Peter, James and John only see our Lord, it becomes clear to all that the true meaning of the Transfiguration is that Christ is the center of all revelation! We must believe in Him and transform our lives to Christ. "The Transfiguration reflects Christ's divinity in an extraordinary way. Just as at his baptism, the voice of his Father was heard calling Christ his "beloved Son." Moses and Elijah both encountered God on a holy mountain, Mt Sinai and Mt. Horeb respectively, and represent the Law and the prophets; Christ at the center of the three-He, Moses and Elijah, indicates he-He, Christ is the center of all Revelation." (Catechism 444, 554)

We ask God to transform our lives/ conform our will to His and that His Blessed Mother intercede for us to help us become a true disciple of Jesus Christ. As the sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith did not hold anything back from God; therefore, we too, are called to give everything back to HIM and HIM alone, and that is our very selves. Lent is that time to reconcile ourselves to God- to make that return back to HIM.
