A cup of Joe . . .

Greetings in Christ, all!

I pray that Spring gets here soon and that we all can soak in some sunshine!

Before I forget, some of you have probably noticed our baptismal font is a bit "off". We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience, but it needed



some work and, in order for that work to be done it needs to be dry. As a result, we have a bowl of Holy Water in the top of the font, but the pump is not running and the bottom part of the font is dry. Obviously our goal is to have it up and running by Easter, if not before.

Since I've returned from Florida, I've really been overwhelmed at the number of people struggling right now and I want to comment on this. First of all, this is pretty normal. Right around this time of year, a lot of us struggle with darkness and dealing with it. If you are struggling, take a moment now and ask God to let you feel His presence. Ask Him to soothe your wounds and give you strength.

Beyond prayer (which is essential), I'd also like to share some other ideas for dealing with inner darkness. Reach out: ask other people about their needs. Pray for them. Actively seek out a way to enter the needs of others with love and devotion. Look through the obituaries and pray for the dead and those who mourn. Few things are more healing than giving of ourselves.

Move: take a walk, make a commitment to knock out that project, whatever it may be, get some movement in. Your mind will fight it, but once you start, it should get easier. I find that my body can be a bit like a diesel engine at times like these: slow to warm up, but once it gets going, its all good.

Be merciful: be merciful with yourself and with others. Take some time and ask God to probe your heart for any anger or lack of forgiveness. Give that to the Lord. Be careful of Social Media: I basically avoid most of it, as it's filled with angry Democrats and angry Republicans, angry Christians and angry atheists, angry sports fans, angry this, angry that. Its simply impossible to soak in that much anger and pride and not be damaged. Liberate yourself by refusing to read the blogs and articles of the perpetually indignant and angry.

Those are some of my ideas and I hope you find them helpful. Let's lift each other up and push onward in the name of Jesus!
