



### Ron's Thoughts...

It was 1986 and I was a young youth minister. A friend of mine came to me with some very disturbing news. She was not a church goer and did not really have much of a faith. She called me to tell me she was pregnant and on her way to get an abortion. I was speechless and didn't know how to respond. In no way could I give her my support. I tried to convince her that I could find a way to help her if she would just turn around. She did not. All she asked was that she wanted me to be there when it was done. What was I to do? How could I be there when I was so against what she was doing? How could she put me in this position? Besides who might see me? I went. As hard as it was I arrived and waited in the car. She came out of the building and came right to my car. I didn't say much and just gave her a hug. As we pulled out of the parking lot 2 people came to my car pounded on my windows and shouted' "Baby killer!" I was devastated. I wanted to shout back, "It's not me!" But, in their eyes, I was.

I have shared that story very little in my life. Even now I risk condemnation, so why now? I AM PRO-LIFE! I am against the very idea of this devastating choice. It is wrong and it is sad that anyone could make this choice. I share this story today because over the years I have witnessed much anger and discord in the dialogue surrounding this very divisive issue. I have listened to both sides and have come to one conclusion. As much as I support the changing of this law, I support greater the necessary means and resources that we need as humanity to CHANGE THE WAY WE THINK, so that this law becomes a mute law. Legal or not legal abortion will continue. Maybe our dialogue and effort should be how do we help people to see as God sees and to look at ALL LIFE with respect and dignity? I have always told my own children that there is never a bad reason for a baby, sometimes the timing might be off, we will let our love for life figure this out. The love for life comes from loving God more and more each day.

As today's Gospel tells us, Loving God with our whole heart, our whole soul and our whole mind means that our lives must revolve around God. We must love him with every part of our lives. Every action of our lives must display the love of God. We are people of God. We are people of love. If we are ever anywhere or involved in anything where the love of God is not evident, then we have no business being there. We pray that we might have the courage to be people of love. And let that love help us see as God sees.

### AFTERWORD....Fr. Dave Howell

FAITH CHAT ...Last Monday in Faith Chat I mentioned that there are 24 Catholic Churches, which surprised many of our listeners. To be more precise, there are six different Churches and 24 variations of these Churches. The six are: The Latin or Roman Rite, the Western Syrian or Antiochene Rite, the Eastern Syrian or Chaldean Rite, the Armenian Rite, the Alexandrian Rite and the Byzantine or Constantinopolitan Rite. There are 24 variations of these. Each one celebrates the same 7 Sacraments but in different ways; each one has deacons, priests & bishops. (All of these variations have married deacons & priests except for the Latin or Roman Rite.) This Monday at 7 pm, I will give some more information on all these 24 Catholic Churches.

CONSCIENCE... Before being ordained to the priesthood, I had to meet with Bishop Povish for what is called the Scrutiny or questioning. We talked for about 30 minutes. What still stands out in my memory was the last few minutes. The bishop asked if I had any questions and, not surprisingly, I did. During the ordination rite for both priests and deacons, the one being ordained folds his hands and place them in the bishop's hands. Then the bishop looks at the candidate and says. "Do you promise me and my successors obedience and respect?" I asked the bishop what he meant when he would ask me that question. He responded by saying that he hoped I would do whatever he asked that was reasonable. Then he said, what do you think it means? I responded by saying I would do anything he asked as long as it did not violate my conscience. He reacted with surprise and said, "Of course, no one should ever do something that violates their conscience." He went on to tell me that with regard to the other part of the question, respect, he did not think that was something he could demand. "I hope, it is something I will earn", he said.

**VOTING ONE'S CONSCIENCE** ...I mention that exchange because in just a few days every citizen over the age of 18 will have the opportunity to vote, if you have not already voted. No one, can tell anyone how they can vote. Nor can anyone use the threat of hell fire and brimstone to coerce someone to vote in a particular way for any candidate or proposition on the ballot. All of us are required by our faith to vote according to the dictates of own our conscience. For I believe that only in following our consciences can we truly gain self-respect.
