





ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT ... In English and Latin we speak of the Holy Spirit using the male pronoun: He. But in the original Greek and even Hebrew (the original languages of the Bible) it is the Holy Spirit: She! While that may seem unimportant to some, I think it is significant. For we speak of God in male terminology but saying the Holy Spirit - She - harkens back to the revelation of Genesis 1:26-27. "Then God said, "Let us make humans in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the birds of the air, the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that crawls on the earth.' So God created humans in the divine image, in the image of God, God created them: male and female God created them" And so we pray to God: Father\Creator of what is seen and unseen; the Son\Redeemer of all humanity and the Spirit\She who is the life-giver! Just another thought to add to our prayer asking for the gift of the Holy Spirit!

WE INTERRUPT THIS MESSAGE... Even though Ordinary Time began Monday, May 24, the two Sundays after Pentecost celebrate two important truths of our Catholic Faith. (The vestments on these Sundays are white not green.) Next week, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity – the profound truth that the one God, is a trinity of persons. June 5/6, we celebrate another profound truth: that the Lord Jesus, who promised to be with us always gives us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist, so that He might fulfill that promise. While Monday we returned to Ordinary Time (meaning counted numbered time) we won't get to the counted Sundays for a couple weeks.

**READING THE BIBLE** ... Part one of Faith Chat last Monday was my suggestions for reading the Bible. The Bible is not a book, but a collection of books, 112 in all. Any one who wants to understand its message needs to skip around. The message of the Bible is two-fold. God, the creator of the universe, has chosen to enter into an intimate, personal and life-giving relationship through a covenant with the Jewish people. God demonstrated that choice through the experience of Exodus. This intimate, personal and life-giving relationship is a bond of self-giving love. Jesus reveals the depth of that selfgiving love by his death & resurrection. So, if you want to read the Bible in a way that explains the unfolding of these special relationships begin in the Old Testament with: Genesis, Exodus, Numbers, Joshua, Judges, Ruth and 1 & 2 Samuel. Then read the prophets Amos, Hosea, Isaiah and Jeremiah. Now move to the New Testament and read: Mark, Matthew, Luke & Acts and John; followed by I & 2 Thessalonians, Philippians, I Corinthians, Galatians, 2 Corinthians, Romans and the 3 Letters of John (these are in chronological order). That should fill a summer!
