

St. Paul writes to the Corinthians; Love is patient, love is kind..... and so forth. I think you know the rest or have at least been to a wedding or two that used this as their wedding reading. It sort of gives you this warm and fuzzy feeling about love. I have preached many a wedding with this reading and I can tell you the LOVE that St. Paul is writing about is far from warm and fuzzy. In fact, I often tell a wedding couple that this LOVE he speaks of is challenging and difficult. It is a LOVE and way of relationship that surrenders self-interest and aspirations for the other person in this relationship. It is a LOVE that says I am going to GIVE UP my happiness to make sure my partner is happy. It is a LOVE that sacrifices all that I have to make sure my partner has all that they need. It is a LOVE that puts the other first before all else.

This is Christian LOVE. It is at the heart of what it means to live every day of your life as a Christian. You might be upset and want to ask, but what about my dreams and my happiness? Well, if this LOVE that St. Paul speaks of is the way you and those around you are living, then your happiness will be taken care of. Your dreams will come true. You will have all that you need. AFTERWORD....Fr. Dave Howell

Catholic funerals take place in three different places or stations. The first is the Vigil or Wake Service the day before as a part of the visitation in the funeral home. It is a short prayer service that has a reading from the Old or New Testament, a Psalm, a Gospel reading, homily and intercessions. Many families will also include a time for sharing cherished memories of the deceased. (Often, the Vigil Service is used to conclude the visitation.) The second station of the funeral is the Liturgy which is normally at church. It is divided into four parts. It begins at the Baptismal font in the back of church. The casket is sprinkled with Baptismal water and then the casket is covered with a large, white cloth called the Pall. The Pall is the reminder of the christening gown so it is usually close family members who place it. Finally, the casket is placed in front of the altar where the Easter candle stands. Together, the water, the Pall and the Easter candle are all part of the Baptismal Rite. We use these symbols at the start of the funeral to recall that our loved one became God's child in Baptism: for in Baptism we die with Christ to rise with him as well. Once the casket has been placed in front of the altar, we move into the Liturgy of the Word. Usually, the family choses the readings from the Old and New Testaments as well as a Gospel passage. The readings reflect what God tells us about our loved one and the new life that is theirs in Christ. The readings are followed by the homily which is a reflection on the Word and life of the one we honor with Christian burial. The third part of the Funeral Liturgy is Eucharistic Prayer. We bring the gifts of bread and wine to the altar in the same way we brought the mortal remains of our loved one. Just as the bread and wine are transformed by the Holy Spirit into the Risen Lord, we pray that the Holy Spirit will raise up and transform our loved one in the pattern of Christ. The fourth part of the funeral Liturgy ends with the prayers of final commendation. Strengthened by God's Word and gift of the Body & Blood of the Risen Lord, commend our loved one into God's hands, asking God to grant him/her eternal light and peace. The third station of a full funeral is the burial of the body or the internment of the ashes. Again, this is done in the context of a short prayer service. Together, these three stations or places are part of the final journey of our loved one as we give them back to God with our thanks. We pray that our loved one will enjoy the fullness of life in Christ and that we who mourn will find comfort in our sorrow.

WILL MY WISHES WILL BE HONORED? ...It is important to put our funeral plans in writing and to have those plans witnessed by two people. These should be known to the family and placed with other important papers. According to Michigan law, written funeral plans signed and witnessed must be followed by the family.
