### Soles with Soul—Gently used Athletic Shoes



### AFTERWORD....Fr. Dave Howell

**SUMMER BULLETINS** ... Taking advantage of the quiet summer, I have decided to use this space for a series of articles on the Sacrament. (If you missed previous articles, I'm sure you can find them somewhere on the parish website!!)

**ON THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS** ... As I mentioned last week, during the last couple of centuries of the first millennium of the Church and into the second millennium, there was a great debate among theologians about what a Sacrament was and how many were there.

Basically, the debate ended with dogmatic definition written by the Fourth Lateran Council in 1215. Many of us learned that basic definition from the Baltimore Catechism: A Sacrament is an outward sign, instituted by Christ to give grace. Another definition is: A Sacrament is a ritual through which we as a community and as individuals encounter the Risen Christ who nourishes, heals and directs us to live his mission to bring the Kingdom of God into this world. The first three Sacraments are the Sacraments of Initiation by which a person is immersed in Christ and his Body, the Church. Those are the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The next two are Sacraments of Healing: the Sacrament of Penance and the Sacrament of the Sick. The first is a ritual encounter with Christ who heals the body and the mind. The second is a ritual encounter with Christ who heals the spirit and soul. The last two are Sacraments of Mission. Just as Jesus sent his disciples out in pairs to proclaim the Kingdom, Christ sends a wife and husband into the world to proclaim the love of God by their love for each other, their children and their family & friends. In the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the Lord sends bishops, priests and deacons into the Church to build communities of love and faith that strengthen one another and proclaim God's good news of love to the world. Over the coming weeks, I will describe each of them in
