Ron's Thoughts...

Being in my line of work I often get questions about life and faith and what all this means. People want the answer, and they think because I have spent my life surrounded by faith experiences that I might have some insight. I don't know if I have any greater insight than the next person, but I do know this, GOD GIVES MEANING AND PURPOSE TO MY LIFE. When the question comes my way, I just say, "Life is about Jesus Christ. It begins with Jesus and ends with Jesus. Anything and everything that matters flows from Him and returns to Him." This is the fundamental message of Christianity.

Today we reflect on the Transfiguration of Jesus. When Jesus brought Peter, James, and John up that mountain, he met with Moses and Elijah. WE INTERRUPT THIS SEASON!! ... So, today should have been the 19th Sunday of the Church Year, but our counted Sundays get interrupted by the celebration of the Transfiguration. While many folks don't realize it, it is such an important event in the Gospel that we celebrate it twice each year. The first time is the Second Sunday of Lent and the other time is the Feast of the Transfiguration on August 6. In some countries this is a holy day and even a public holiday. It's important enough to the Christian Community that it preempts the regular schedule when it falls on a Sunday. So what makes it so important? The transfiguration of Jesus occurs as Jesus begins his last journey to Jerusalem where he will suffer, die and rise. In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark & Luke, Jesus has made it clear (3 times) that he will suffer, die and rise. On their journey south to those fateful events, Jesus takes Peter, James & John up to Mt. Tabor. There they see him as he will be after the resurrection. It is a glimpse of not just what he will be, but also of what we will be as we pass through death to risen life. It is an image that is important enough that we commemorate it twice each year. It gives us an image of our own future. It's good to keep that image in mind.

THE HOLY LAND & JORDAN ... I have preliminary prices for a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and Jordan next spring. The dates are May 7–24, 2024. Unfortunately, the prices came back higher than I had anticipated. Since the pandemic there are fewer hotels, higher airfare and overall price inflation. I am still waiting for a final price, but I thought I would let you know, that it still is my intent to follow through on the pilgrimage. Part of the reason it will be more expensive is that it is longer than most similar trips and the final price will include all fees, tips and all meals. The question I am asked most often is: Is it safe to go there. My answer is that it is very safe. Yes, there have been terrorist attacks but none of them have involved pilgrims or tours. In addition, I always ask that we use a Palestinian bus & driver and patronize Palestinian restaurants as much as possible. Since pilgrims & tourists are so important to the local economy, I have never had any concern about safety in the other six times I have been there. My task on the pilgrimage is to plan and celebrate Liturgies at the various sites we will visit. Although we have a local guide for all the places we will visit, I will prepare the Scriptural background for each day and add to the commentary on the various sites we will visit.
