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Sometime around 1980, when McCaffrey Hall was being planned and built, the parish instituted a weekly second collection, with the express purpose of paying down the mortgage on that addition. Thirty-five years later, it had morphed into the “maintenance and debt reduction” collection. The only problem is that we have no debt, so it has since been shortened to the “maintenance” collection. I have had difficulty with that concept, because maintenance of the parish's facilities should be part of its normal operations, not something that's done if you happen to get a little “extra.” I also think that parishioners can start to suffer after awhile from “collection fatigue,” especially on weekends where the national collections (e.g., the Church in Africa, Catholic Communications Campaign, etc.) mean a *third* envelope.

For quite some time, the members of the finance council and I have been debating whether to merge the two weekly parish collections into one; more recently, I've asked the pastoral advisory council to weigh in on the topic. On the one hand, streamlining would cut down our expense for the printing and mailing of envelopes, as well as reduce the amount of time our faithful volunteers spend counting the collection. More importantly, it would, I believe, convey the message that good stewardship includes *all* facets of parish life – ministries, employee salaries and benefits, utilities, insurance, etc. – and maintenance. On the other hand, there is a real fear that, in potentially eliminating the second collection, we'd be sending the message that we don't need that money, which is most assuredly *not* the case! (What we'd be asking, in essence, is that everyone put in one envelope what is now being split into two.)

If anyone has a strong opinion either way, I would be happy and interested to hear it.

St. John School recently celebrated all of their athletes at the annual Sports Awards Banquet. The cheer, basketball and soccer teams were all in attendance, along with their parents. The highlight of the evening was guest speaker Reagan Stroka, a 2013 Redhawk alumna. Reagan is graduating from Immaculate Heart Academy and will be attending Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in the fall to study computer and aerospace engineering. She is the recipient of the Rensselaer Medal as well as a 4-year Naval ROTC Scholarship. Below please find the beautiful message that Reagan shared with the Redhawks.



Good evening. I'd first like to thank the St John's administration for inviting me to speak today. I'm very excited to be back here, and am searching the crowd for familiar faces out there, but everyone's grown up a lot!

I'm have been asked here to speak with you about athletics and the impact they have had on my life. I started playing basketball in sixth grade, and played until the year I graduated St. John's, which was 2013. Those three years, I worked my butt off at practice, I came to every game, and I was never a starter. Not once. It was tough, because when you put in all that work and you can tell that you're not getting all that much better at what you're doing, it can be discouraging.

I loved the girls on my team, though, and I loved my coaches, and I enjoyed basketball well enough, so I could live with it. When you average two points a season, scoring is much more exciting I think.

My basketball career ended the winter of my eighth grade year. I haven't played on a basketball team since then. But at the end of season banquet - the same one you are attending this evening - I received the Michael Jordan

award. It was shocking for a couple reasons, the first being that I wasn't sure what I would be getting an award for, and the second being that it was really important.

My coach, Mr. Dennehy, had referenced Michael Jordan constantly throughout the season. He particularly liked to reference something Jordan is quoted as saying:

"I've missed more than 9000 shots in my career. I've lost almost 300 games. 26 times, I've been trusted to take the game winning shot and missed. I've failed over and over and over again in my life. And that is why I succeed."

The basis of it is that Michael Jordan works just as hard as anyone else - maybe harder. He fails, and fails, and fails, just like the rest of us. His success isn't due to any natural talent, but to perseverance, dedication, time and effort.

And so when Mr. Dennehy announced that he would be giving out the Michael Jordan award for the second year now, we all knew what it meant. We knew the quote practically by heart, we understood what it meant for us. The Michael Jordan award was a tribute to dedication, to not giving up even when it looked like maybe you should and you may have wanted to, to perseverance.

I'm sure you can tell where this is going, but that award went to me. It was probably the most exciting, validating moment of any of my three seasons; possibly to this day! I could hear Mr. Dennehy telling us about him, reminding us that Jordan missed 9000 shots and lost 300 games but I thought, he also plays in the NBA, so he's allowed to do that. Of course hard work got him there, but what I really saw Jordan as contributing was his talent, his ability to win games and nothing more.

But the message Mr. Dennehy was giving me by presenting me with the Michael Jordan award was that I didn't have to be scoring points to be contributing to the team, or contributing to myself. Ultimately, he was teaching me a much bigger lesson. And here are a few things that I took away from this very formative moment:

1. One hard worker can change the atmosphere of an entire team. You don't have to be the best, or the strongest, but if you can inspire those around you to be better than they are, you've already succeeded.
2. Hard work does not go unnoticed. We've all had those days where we're doing everything we can to improve ourselves, but it seems like none of it is paying off. People who are close to you see what you're doing. They appreciate you.
3. Something does not have to be your favorite, best activity for forever and ever to matter to you, to change you. Basketball did not set me on a path to become a WNBA player, but it did give me the confidence to try out for the volleyball team in high school, and then the cross country team when I didn't make the volleyball team. I met some of my best friends now on the cross country team, and I've gotten to do some incredible things - like training with Navy SEALs - and in a way, that's all because I played basketball for three years in middle school.

This doesn't just apply to sports, either. You don't ever have to be the smartest, or the funniest, or the best liked, or the loudest, or the most musically talented person in the room. You don't have to be perfect right off the bat. If you work hard at what you do. If you don't give up because it's hard, or because you're "not good enough" at it. If you keep trying. That's perfect. That's what makes you perfect.

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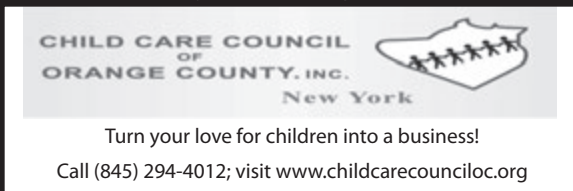
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
