Beatitudes

Jesus gave laws and teachings to follow; some are found in the Beatitudes. In the promises we are offered in the Beatitudes, we are presented with decisive moral choices. We are invited to purify our hearts of bad instincts and to seek God's will above all things. St. Gregory of Nyssa saw the Beatitudes in an ascending order; one leading to the next higher goal.

The Beatitudes teach us that true happiness is not found in riches or well-being, in fame, achievement, or power,...but in obedience to God's commands. Although they seem not to offer happiness, the Beatitudes invite us to look beyond immediate gratification and satisfaction and to trust God's ways above our instincts. They promise certain goodnesses in this world and heaven in the next; therefore, it is to hold something precious and meaningful. The Beatitudes involve inner activities (being pure in spirit, pure of heart, hungering and thirsting for righteousness, meekness) and outer activities (bring persecuted, being a peacemaker, being merciful, mourning); sometimes it involves both inner and outer action.

Although there are many ways to understand and interpret the Beatitudes, one way is: 1) poor in spirit= to see our need of God; 2) mourn...for our sins; 3) meekly... submit to God's will; 4) hunger and thirst (deep desire) ...for what is right; 5) mercy is doing what is right and obeying God; 6) pure of heart= cleansed within, by pursuing what is right and God's will; 7) peacemakers are reconciled with God and others; 8) willing to be criticized for doing what is right...and persecuted.

Kingdom of God

One of Jesus' chief teachings was "The Kingdom of God." The Kingdom of God is made up of people who follow what Jesus tells them to do, such as asking God to forgive our sins, forgiving others, and choosing to belong to His Church.

Jesus taught that His followers should be a light to the world; should forgive and be reconciled with everyone, should not lust after anyone, should not divorce, should not retaliate; they should love their enemies, pray for their persecutors, give alms, and fast. They should not store up treasures on earth, should not worry, should not judge others. Jesus said that the way to heaven is narrow (not easy), that there will be false teachers, that His disciples had to do God's will and follow what Jesus Himself said. In summary, His followers must love and forgive.

Church History—The French Revolution (cont)

27. Name two other French scientists of this period who were devout Catholics that counter the notion that the Church is anti-science. Louis Pasteur, whose work in micro-biology has lasted to this day, and the genius mathematician/scientist, Blaise Pascal.
28. What is Pascal most noted for? Pascal is most noted for his "wager" of which so certain of the power of Christianity, he wagered that if one accepted Baptism and practiced the faith devoutly for one full year, the convert would become convinced by the TRUTH and cease in his unbelief.
29. Who were some of the leading Enlightenment philosophers of the day who supported the Revolution? There were many but let's consider six: Montesquieu, Diderot, Robespierre, Rousseau, and Voltaire.
30. Charles Montesquieu (1689-1755): In "The Spirit of the Laws", he wrote that government should be divided into three branches: the executive, the legislative and the judicial.
31. Denis Diderot (1713-1784): Most noted for work, "Encyclopedie", a 17 volume tome of essays and artwork highlighting and promoting many of the influential Enlightenment philosophies advocating a new world order anathema to traditional mores.
32. Maximillian Robespierre (1758-1794): Viewed as the leader of the French Revolution whose radicalism led to the deadly formation of the Jacobin Party and the massive body count known as the reign of terror".
33. Jean Jacques Rousseau (1712-1778): His work, "The Social Contract" directly influenced the French Revolution and in many ways offered justification for it. He argued that the best society is one with representative government so long as the rulers seek the will of the people.
34. Voltaire (1694-1778): A vociferous opponent of anyone who attempted to limit man's limitations at self-expression and self-rule. His support for unfettered human independence chronicled in his "Letters Concerning the English Nation" where he extols the thinking of Newton and Locke.

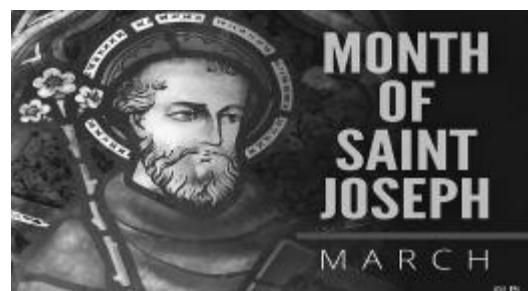
