



Beloved of God,

Meditation on Father's Day

"Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven."
(Matthew 23:9)



Quarterly, at least four times a year over the past twenty-three years, some Christian of another faith, or someone who has issues with the Catholic Church will use this quote to attack the Church and attempt to undermine the faith. *"Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven."* This may have occurred to you as well with the natural reaction of defensiveness over what has become a normal way for those in the Catholic Church to refer to Her clergy. Quite possibly there may also be doubt because since all the priests are only human and have at times made mistakes, some being egregious atrocities, some may ask, "Why should we call priests 'father?'" With this logic, why should we call anyone father?

So then, let's just cancel *Father's Day*. Any reasonable person would see how ludicrous this statement is. The reasonable would say, obviously, God did not mean that we were not allowed to call our earthly male parent "father," or some form thereof because recall that when Jesus was asked by His disciples how to pray, He said... *"This is how you are to pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name."* (Matthew 6:9) The word for father was "*abba*" which is a familiar form of the word more like "daddy." Those arguing the case might bring up next these words of Jesus in attempt to confuse us and undermine the humanity of Jesus, *"Who is my mother? Who are my brothers?"* (Matthew 12:48) This quote is both incomplete with Jesus intending a completely different point... *"And stretching out His hand toward His disciples, He said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of My heavenly Father is My brother, and sister, and mother.'"* (Ibid 12:49-50)

So let us not only keep *Father's Day* but turn once again to the scriptures for a deeper meaning of our Heavenly Father and an example of what fathers should strive to emulate...

"Father, they are Your gift to Me. I wish that where I am they also may be with Me, that they may see My glory that You gave Me, because You loved Me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world also does not know You, but I know You, and they know that You sent Me. I made known to them Your name and I will make it known, that the love with which You loved Me may be in them and I in them." (John 17:24-26)

A Father's Prayer... Dear God, these children are Your gift to me. May I realize that as gift, they were carefully chosen by You for me. They were entrusted to me by You. As You are their heavenly Father, and as You continually extend Your care to them, may I learn from Your example of how I am to be their father. When Your Son Jesus said, *"I wish that where I am they also may be,"* may I understand that the most important task I have is to fulfill the words of Jesus, *"Let the children come to Me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."* (Matthew 19:14) It is for me to bring them to You so that You in turn will bring them to the Father. In order for this to be done, I must know You. I must learn about You. And, then, in turn, I must teach what I have learned and what I know and how much I love You, to my children. May nothing I do, may none of the choices I make, make them feel second in my heart or in my day. May I realize that You must always be first in my life and that lesson be the most important one I will teach my children, these gifts You have given me. Amen.
