FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16 The kingdom of David shall endure for ever before the Lord.

Psalm 89 "For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord."

Romans 16:25-27 The mystery kept secret for long ages has now been manifested.

Luke 1:26-38 Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son.

Today we hear the familiar story of the angel Gabriel announcing to Mary that She will conceive and bear the Son of God. What an unbelievable message this must have been! She was seemingly just an ordinary young woman, not even married, not even having relations with a man. As a Jew, She would have been praying for the coming of the Messiah; now She is told She would be giving birth to Him. But like David in the Old Testament, She accepts the role God has for her. "May it be done to me according to Your word" (Luke 1:38).

Beloved of God,

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;
Upon those who lived in a land of gloom a light has shone.
You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing;
They rejoice before You as people rejoice at harvest, as they exult when dividing the spoils.
For the yoke that burdened them, the pole on their shoulder,
The rod of their taskmaster, You have smashed, as on the day of Midian.
For every boot that tramped in battle, every cloak rolled in blood, will be burned as fuel for fire.
For a child is born to us, a Son is given to us; upon His shoulder dominion rests.
They name Him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace.
(Isaiah 9:1-5)

There is a great darkness over the land, and it is not limited to this country. The Evil One and his forces are attacking peace everywhere. There are wars. There are threats of wars. There is killing. There is abortion. There is rampant infidelity within marriage. The family is not only broken but is being shattered by legal forces to redefine the God-given creation of Marriage (Genesis 1 &2). A woman was allowed to "marry" a tree. Two men with in the same family, brothers, were allowed to "marry" each other. Truly, the *people are walking in darkness*. They are *living in lands of gloom*. Hunger, starvation, genocide exist in every country. The Evil One seems to be winning. But…

(Luke 1:30-35)

Jesus Christ is the light to the world. As the Psalmist wrote, "For You, Lord, give light to my lamp; my God brightens my darkness." (18:29) The Pure Light of Jesus Christ is the only source of true healing for the world that will not only expose the darkness but will also conquer it and bring about abundant joy and great rejoicing.

Jesus Christ... the Light and Savior of the World.
