Ezekiel 17:22-24 I have lifted high the lowly tree.

Psalm 92 "Lord, it is good to give thanks to You."

Mark 4:26-34 It is the smallest of all seeds, and becomes the largest of plants.

As we approach the first day of summer, we hear readings today that are set in nature. Ezekiel has a vision of God cutting a tender shoot from the top of a cedar and planting it on a lofty mountain where it grows into a majestic tree. Mark relates two of Jesus' parables involving sowing seeds, one being the tiny mustard seed, which grows into a shady, hearty plant. As we listen to today's readings, may the Lord's word take root in us.

The recipe for the chicken legs and thighs is as follows: Wash and clean chicken, season, place chicken in large tray, add 1/2 cup water. Bake at 375 degrees skin side down for 45 minutes, turn chicken over, season and bake skin side up for an additional 45 minutes. When the chicken is done sprinkle with paprika.

Father's Day: I would like to wish all of our Fathers, Grandfathers, Godfathers, and Spiritual Fathers... a Blessed Day.

The Cardinal's Appeal: The Cardinal Appeal is progressing. Your gift to the Appeal helps to fund many Charities to the people in our archdiocese and throughout the world. To date our parish has received \$51527.00 in pledges and gifts towards the 2018 Cardinal's Appeal from 210 families. Our parish has 1582

registered households with multiple families living within those homes. This appeal is extremely important to our parish and other organizations in the Archdiocese. The Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal assists our aging priests in nursing homes, works of charity, and assists our catholic schools missions and evangelization, as well as needy parishes. The goal for Saint Eugene Parish is \$96,000.00. If every household that remains gave just \$100.00 per household that would net us \$142,700.00. 
For Fathers, who have given us life and love that we may show them the love and affection today and all days ... we pray to You, O God, Our Father.



Meditation for Father's Day

"Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven."
(Matthew 23:9)



Quarterly, at least four times a year over the past twenty-nine years, some Christian of another faith, or someone who has issues with the Catholic Church, will use this quote... *"Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven..."* to attack the Catholic Church and attempt to undermine my faith or that of others... *"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea."* (Matthew 18:6) This may have occurred to you as well with the natural reaction of defensiveness over what has become for the Catholic Church a normal way for the faithful to refer to Her clergy. Quite possibly there may also be doubt in your own minds because, after all the priests are only human, have made many mistakes and some egregious atrocities, and the quote is from the Bible, the inspired word of God.

Well then, let's just cancel *Father's Day* completely, since we cannot in any way call a man on earth "our father." Any reasonable person would see how ludicrous this statement is. The reasonable would say, obviously, God did not mean that we were not allowed to call our earthly male parent "father," or some form thereof. Recall that when Jesus was asked by His disciples how to pray, He said... *"This is how you are to pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name."* (Matthew 6:9) The word for father was "abba" which is a familiar form of the word more like "daddy." Those arguing the case might bring up next these words of Jesus in attempt to confuse us and undermine the humanity of Jesus, *"Who is my mother? Who are my brothers?"* (Matthew 12:48) This quote is both incomplete... *"And stretching out His hand toward His disciples, He said, 'Here are My mother and My brothers. For whoever does the will of My heavenly Father is My brother, and sister, and mother...'"* (Matthew 12:49-50) with Jesus intending to teach that obedience to the will of God supersedes all other relationships in this world.

So let us not only keep *Father's Day* but turn once again to the scriptures for a deeper meaning of our Fatherhood and an example of what fathers should strive to emulate. At the Last Supper, Our Blessed Lord was praying...

"Father, they are Your gift to Me. I wish that where I am they also may be with Me, that they may see My glory that You gave Me, because You loved Me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world also does not know You, but I know You, and they know that You sent Me. I made known to them Your name and I will make it known, that the love with which You loved Me may be in them and I in them." (John 17:24-26)

A Father's Prayer...

Dear God, these children are Your gift to me. May I realize that as gift, they were carefully chosen by You for me. They were entrusted to me by You. As You are their heavenly Father, and as You continually extend Your care to them, may I learn from Your example of how I am to be their father. When Your Son Jesus said, "I wish that where I am they also may be," may I understand that the most important task I have is to fulfill these words of Jesus, "Let the children come to Me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14) It is for me to bring them to You so that You in turn will bring them to the Father. In order for this to be done, I must know You. I must learn about You. And, then, in turn, I must teach what I have learned and what I know and how much I love You, to my children. May nothing I do, may none of the choices I make, make them feel second in my heart or in my day. May I realize that You must always be first in my life and may that lesson be the most important one I will teach my children – these gifts You have given me. Amen.
