

Perseverance



Sometimes we need to be patient and see where God leads us. I always prayed to be a sister. Entering Religious Life at an early age presented a couple of challenges. My family supported me to become a teacher but not a sister. But persistent as I am, I bugged them until they agreed. They said we will support you but we know you will be lonesome and return home to Chicago. I then met a girl at a youth rally who joined me as we planned our entrance to enter the Sisters of St. Joseph in Concordia, Kansas.

God calls us in different ways. My calling was one of attraction. I admired the priests and sisters who were happy, enthusiastic, and so much fun. Their strong influence on me helped to make a decision to live a life devoted to serving God and the Church. I loved the Sisters of St. Joseph who were my teachers in grade school and high school.

Did I ever think of leaving my community? Yes, but not because I wasn't happy but to try a different ministry. I gave it time and didn't act on it. I am grateful for God's grace to have persevered in my Religious Vocation for 75 years.

For me, Religious Life means that I have been blessed abundantly in every way. God had given me more than I have hoped for. I am blessed with good health and happiness. At this moment and time, Religious Life has been a family to me. God has been good to me in my ministries.

In 1969, I was assigned to Curé of Ars Parish School. After a few years, my order stopped assigning jobs and sisters were able to choose the ministry we felt God called us to. Prayer and Community are my focus as I continue to celebrate God's grace of perseverance as a Sister of St. Joseph. I am celebrating my 52nd year at Curé of Ars Parish. My ministries have been teacher, Elementary Religious Education director, and presently I am part-time in parish ministry and assisting Fr. Storey with parish funerals.

Today if a young woman would be interested in joining a community, she would want to do research on the internet to see which order appeals to her and where she feels she would fit. While this is very different than when I joined, the essence of Religious Life has not changed. It is now what it has always been but the way it is lived out has changed. That is what makes it look different to a lot of people.

So God calls each of us to a vocation – to be single or married, join the priesthood or Religious Life, be ordained a deacon – all which reflect a particular Gospel Call. Together we all offer a complete picture of God's plan for his people.

I would like to express my deep gratitude to all of you for the support and gift of friendship you have given to me.

The Way, the Truth and the Life



Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension. Many of us grew up celebrating it as Ascension Thursday, a Holy Day of Obligation, 40 days after Easter. Because of its importance as a feast day, it was made a diocesan option in the United States to celebrate the Ascension on the traditional Thursday or on the following Sunday as we now do in the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas. Through the different Evangelists, we learn that Jesus appeared to His disciples and to others multiple times during those 40 days following His Resurrection, but they did not know Him. It was only when their eyes were opened that they recognized the Lord.

We might be a bit surprised to learn that St. Luke was the writer not only of a Gospel, but also of the Acts of the Apostles. This knowledge may have escaped us because when we read from Acts during the Liturgy of the Mass, selections are introduced as “A reading from the Acts of the Apostles,” with no author cited. Both Luke’s Gospel and his Acts of the Apostles were addressed to “Theophilus” which means “Friend of God.” Luke wanted to use his writings to influence his friend, whom he addresses as Theophilus, to draw closer to God.

Interestingly, in the final chapter of his Gospel, Luke notes the time of the Ascension as the evening of Easter Sunday, the same day that the empty tomb was discovered. In Acts, Luke places it 40 days later. We must recall that Luke was not delineating an historical timeline; rather, he was teaching spiritual truths.

As the time neared for Jesus to return to the Father, He told His disciples that He had to leave – but He let them down ever so easy. We read in John 14: “Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; now have faith in me.” Jesus explained, “In my Father’s house there are many dwelling places. I am going to prepare a place for you. I will come back and take you to myself. Where I am going you know the way.” Thomas objected, saying “we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?” Jesus enlightened him: **I am the Way, the Truth and the Life.** No one comes to the Father except through me.

Luke described how Jesus was taken from the sight of His disciples. In the detail that Luke provides in Acts, note the similarity to what occurred at the empty tomb early on Easter morning. “While they were looking intently at the sky as He was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, ‘Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen Him going into heaven’” (*Acts 1:10-11*). Just before He ascended into heaven, Jesus commissioned the disciples to go preach to all nations, to baptize and to live what He had taught them. He told them to stay in Jerusalem to wait for the promise of the Father because in a few days they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit. Then He was lifted up and taken from their sight.

Lord Jesus, open our eyes as you did for your disciples that we may truly see you. Open our hearts that we may truly love you and be guided in your way by your truths and your light. Lead us to the place you have prepared for us in your Father’s house. Amen!

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

My name is Matt Loehr, and I am the Interim Executive Director for the St. Mary's Home for Mothers project. My wife Linda and I have lived in the Liberty Area for the last 16 years and have resided in Clay County for over 30 years. I am reaching out to you to extend a personal invitation to tour our prospect home and to meet with me, other Board Members, and our amazing volunteers at our open house on May 22 from 10 am – 2 pm. It is our desire to use the structure that was once home to the Benedictine Sisters of the Holy Rosary to now serve adult women who are pregnant and their children at the site. While up to fifteen mothers may live at the Home from all different backgrounds and faiths, the organization will be influenced by our Catholic identity and traditions. Mothers can stay at the site post-delivery if the need is present. The criterion for admission is that these are pregnant women, who might otherwise choose to abort their child due to homelessness or lacking familial support. The St. Mary's Home for Mothers will provide a safe and supportive environment. Please note that this is a voluntary program. We are planning several improvements to the property that include raised gardens, an orchard, vineyard, and a walking trail. **Address:** 23615 NE 100th St, Liberty, MO. 64068. This is a 13.71-acre lot with a house containing 18 bedrooms and 10 plus bathrooms. Please try to attend if possible. I look forward to meeting you and to share this exciting news to promote life and protect our most vulnerable.


