

Catechist Corner - Liturgy of the Word

At each Sunday and Holy Day Mass, we hear three readings and a psalm from the Bible which we believe have been divinely inspired and tells us about the story of God's plan of salvation for those who follow Him. Some people who are unfamiliar with the Mass are surprised to find out that most of the words and phrases of the prayers of the Mass are taken from the Bible.

Where does the First Reading come from?

The First Reading is read from the Old Testament (except during the Easter season). In the Old Testament, we hear about the covenants that God made with our Hebrew ancestors and the consequences of not keeping those covenants. The first reading is often a "type" or prophetic symbol that foreshadows something or someone in the Gospel reading. During the Easter season, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles which tells the story of the early Church. We sit to listen to the first two readings and a psalm.

What is the significance of the Psalms?

After the First Reading, we sing or recite from the Book of Psalms. More than half of the psalms are attributed to King David who put into practice the use of music and poetry into worship. These have been sung by the people of Israel for centuries. It provides a combination of all the teachings of the Old Testament. The psalms were also recited by Jesus, Mary, the apostles and the first Christian martyrs. In addition to the Mass, the Church has taken them as its official prayer to be recited every day by priests and religious in the Liturgy of the Hours.

Where does the Second Reading come from?

The Second Reading always comes from the New Testament and is usually taken from one of the letters of St. Paul or another apostolic writing. Unlike the First Reading, these readings are not usually coordinated with the Gospel reading.

What is unique about the Gospel?

The Gospel is proclaimed by a priest or deacon. A priest or deacon bows to the altar as we stand out of reverence for the unique presence of Jesus Christ to hear from one of the four Gospels and the reading is introduced by an acclamation of praise. Except during Lent, that acclamation is "Alleluia," which is a Hebrew phrase meaning "Praise the Lord!" While the Gospel is being introduced, a priest or deacon makes a small sign of the cross on the Book of the Gospels and greets us with the "Lord be with you" and we respond, "And with your Spirit." We join the priest or deacon in marking a small cross on our forehead, lips, and heart with our thumb while the priest or deacon prays silently, "Lord, may your words be on my mind, heart, and lips so that I may know, speak, and love your Word" and then he proclaims the Gospel. The priest or deacon concludes with these words, "The Gospel of the Lord" and we respond, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." Our response proclaims our faith in Jesus Christ. The word "Gospel" translated from Greek means "Good News." The "Good News" is that God desires for all men to be saved and this has been made possible through the life, death, and resurrection of his Son, Jesus Christ.

Next week, we will learn more about the Homily, Creed, and Universal Prayers.




