

I'd like your input on a suggestion that I received from a parishioner concerning this past year's Christmas Eve Mass schedule while Christmas is still fresh in our minds. In past years we used to have two Masses on Christmas Eve, one at 4:00 PM and the other at 5:30 PM - which we moved to 6:00 PM to better control the flow of the crowds - plus Midnight Mass. Over time, however, attendance at the second Mass was getting so light that it became unnecessary. In 2016 Christmas fell on a Sunday. To avoid any confusion, I kept the regular weekend Mass schedule for Christmas, adding Midnight Mass, which still draws a good crowd. This past year I kept the same schedule that we used in 2016. I thought it would be easier to remember, since it is simply the regular weekend schedule plus Midnight Mass. I only had two people question it. One was merely asking if we were having Mass Christmas Eve at 4:00 PM. Another parishioner very politely asked if we could go back to 4:00 PM, as 5:00 PM was a bit late to accommodate their Christmas Eve dinner plans every year. I have no problem restoring the Mass to 4:00 PM, but I'd hate to do it and then find out that other people preferred Mass at 5:00 PM. It makes no difference to me whatsoever, and I'd be happy to put the Mass at a time that accommodates the most

people. I'd like to get your feedback. Do you have a strong preference for Mass on Christmas Eve at 4:00 PM or at 5:00 PM? Again, the thought behind each time is this: 4:00 PM makes it easier for some people to go to Mass and then get home in time to prepare Christmas Eve dinner or to get where they need to be. Mass at 5:00 PM keeps the usual Sunday schedule and makes it easier to remember. Let me know what your feelings are and I'll schedule the Christmas Eve Mass next year for the time that accommodates the most people.
