

From the Parish House

Dear Parishioners,

18 June 2017

Today is Father's Day, and I extend best wishes to all the fathers of the parish as they celebrate 'their' day! Given the current social climate, many people forget that fatherhood is a vocation given by God Himself. Fathers enter into a sacred union with their wives, a union blessed by God, and in so doing, they become 'co-creators' with Him in the act of procreation. He has designed this sacred union to reflect the union of the Trinity itself. It is for these reasons that the Church is so opposed to the civil proposals to allow for same-sex marriages. The ultimate goals of marriage are the salvation of the souls of those who are called to it, and the continuance of the human race by the procreation of children. This is a sacred relationship enshrined in the very nature of our biological make-up. Anything to the contrary is contrary to natural law itself. So let us truly celebrate the sacred nature of fatherhood, thank our heavenly Father for giving it to us, and strenuously seek to defend it from all attacks.

Today is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Our Lord Jesus promised to be with us until the end of time, and gave us the Holy Eucharist in fulfillment of His promise. When we come to Mass, we experience that presence in a special way. In our second Eucharist Prayer, following the consecration of the bread and wine, the priest says "We offer You, Lord, the Bread of Life and the Chalice of salvation, giving thanks that You have held us worthy to be in Your presence and minister to You. Think about that for a minute. We are in the presence of the Eternal God, Who was, Who is, and Who is to come, the creator of all, the Redeemer of all, and the Sanctifier of all. And we minister to Him. What does it mean to minister? To do for another. What do we do for God? We come into His presence, we offer Him our love, and allow Him to love us by receiving the gift of Himself in Holy Communion. God thinks so much of us that He considers us worthy to be in his presence. When we leave here and go back into the hectic pace of our everyday lives, will we think of God as being worthy to be a part of our daily living?

A parting chuckle: During a Little League game, the coach asked one of his young players. "Do you understand what cooperation is? What a team is?" The boy nodded. "Do you understand that what matters is whether we win together as a team?" The boy nodded. "So, when a strike is called, or you're out at first, you understand that you don't argue with, or curse or yell at the umpire? Do you understand all that?" The boy once again nodded his understanding. "Good!" said the coach. "Now go over there and explain it to your father!"

In authoritative and encouraging words, Jesus urges the apostles to fear nothing -- only him who can destroy the soul. Telling them "every hair of your head has been counted," he promises that "Whoever acknowledges me before men I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven."

What exactly is the course about?

It is a teaching of spirituality based on the New Testament, lives of saints and spiritualties of other great religions. Every class begins with verses taken from the New Testament. For example, Christ tells us to "be awake, do not fear, you are the light of the world." These and other words of Christ are taken very seriously and deepened in language that is both understandable and acceptable to the average Christian.
