



TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 55:6-9

Isaiah expresses an urgent plea that all should seek the Lord and turn to him for mercy.

Second Reading: Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a

In a strongly personal message from Paul while in prison, he says that he wishes “to be freed from this life and to be with Christ,” but he realizes that he still has much important work to do.

Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16a

Jesus tells the parable of the owner of an estate who hires workmen for his vineyard. When, at the end of the day, he pays a full day’s wage to those who worked only one hour, those who worked all day complained bitterly. But the owner says, “I am free to do as I please, am I not?” Jesus reminds us through this parable that “the last shall be first and the first shall be last.”

From Fr. Nelson

Dear Parishioners,

We are entering the season when a group of children of our parish will be receiving the Eucharist for the very first time. This year we have 40+ kids who are eagerly waiting for this great day. Of course before that they will also be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. So I thought that it would be beneficial for us to look again at our faith and at our belief in Sacraments.

Generally speaking, a Sacrament in the Catholic Church consists of outward signs which are instituted by Christ to give us Grace. This outward sign carries within it a hidden Mystery. In Baptism the outward sign is the pouring of water and the inner Mystery of receiving the Grace of Sonship. In Holy Communion the outward signs are the bread and wine and the inner Mystery of Grace being the presence of the Body (Flesh) and the Blood of Jesus Christ. Every Sacrament is a great Mystery of faith.

Sacraments are in fact the powers that come forth from the Body of Christ. They are the ways and means that God nourishes our being with all the help we need at various stages of our lives. Since the Sacraments proceed from the Church which is Holy and Apostolic, the Church must hold on to the Holy and Sacred Tradition. They cannot be changed or modified by the minister or the community.
