### **Making restitution**

My wife and I belonged to an evangelical fellowship and sent our children to their Christian day school. Our tuition discount required that we tithe, but we never did. When we returned to the Catholic Church and I confessed this sin. I was told to make restitution. I don't remember the tuition rates or our income at the time. I want to do this penance but not be legalistic about it.

The Seventh Commandment-You shall not steal—"requires respect for the universal destination of goods and respect for the right to private property" (Exodus 20:15; CCC 2401). The virtue of justice empowers us "to preserve our neighbor's rights and render him what is his due," including "the restitution of stolen goods to their owner...in proportion to their responsibility and to their share of what was stolen" (CCC 2407, 2412).

I'm glad you are restoring any injustice you were responsible for. Catholic moral teaching requires that we be as exact as possible in making restitution but also recognizes that determining an exact amount is sometimes impossible. In these cases, we should simply make the best estimate we can, return that amount, and be at peace. Your willingness and desire to be generous are praiseworthy. Like Zacchaeus, the tax collector who made restitution upon encountering Jesus, I'm sure the Lord will be pleased with your effort (Luke 19:1-10).


