

Next Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent. We are called to use the Advent season as a time of prayer and reflection in anticipation of our celebration of the Feast of Christmas.

Advent is a reminder to us that Christ has come. Christ comes. And Christ will come again. Christ has come. With the birth of Jesus more than 2,000 years ago, the reign of God entered our world. The reign of God is present whenever persons embody in their lives the values to which Jesus Christ gave witness in his life – compassion, mercy, reconciliation, healing, generosity, service, kindness and openness to all persons. These values will prevail over evil and sin. We know this because Jesus, through his suffering, death and resurrection, broke the power of sin and evil once for all. Sin and death cannot conquer us, or our world. We, therefore, should remain steadfast in our efforts to live the values of Jesus Christ in the confidence that those values will prevail just as Christ prevailed over sin, suffering and death.

Christ comes. Christ comes into our world daily. In our lives of prayer, in his self-revelation in the Scriptures (He is the Word of God!), in the sacraments, and in the good deeds that persons of good will do daily. Do we make Christ present each day through the witness of our lives – by our efforts to incarnate in our lives the values of Jesus Christ?

Christ will come. This world will end. For most of us, this simply means that we will die and in our death we will encounter the Risen Christ. Will we have lived lives in such faithfulness to Christ and his Gospel that Christ recognizes us as his own and brings us to share in his own risen, glorious life?

Advent gives us the opportunity to reflect on the great gift that God gave us in Jesus Christ. It gives us the opportunity to reflect on whether we are living in a way that makes Christ present in our world through our lives so that we are ready to encounter Christ when he comes again in our individual deaths.

ENDURANCE AND PATIENCE - We celebrate today what is popularly called the Feast of Christ the King. In this particular year 2016, however, it is a greater celebration than usual. As always we commemorate the fact that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is indeed the King of the Universe. Pope Pius XI declared, "He (Jesus) must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things." His point was that Christ needs to be at the center of our lives, which is exactly what stewardship calls for - living Christ centered lives. It was Pope Paul VI who moved this time to rejoice to this date, which is also the final Sunday of our liturgical year, as Advent and the new Church year begin next week. Finally, today also marks the culmination of our Holy Year of Mercy. The word "mercy" appears some 276 times in the Bible (almost the same as the word "truth"). Jesus told us it is never too late for mercy, for conversion, for making Him the center of our lives.
