FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On the Fourth of July, Americans celebrate their freedom. But as Catholic Christians, we should understand the true source and true purpose of our freedom.

As St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Romans, God liberated us from our slavery to sin through our baptism in Jesus Christ. Sin has no power over the person who lives in faithfulness to the life of Jesus Christ. The true source of our freedom, therefore, is God and we receive the gift of our freedom in baptism. We are freed by God to live in faithfulness to the way of Jesus Christ so that we can have the confident hope that we will one day share in his risen life forever. This then reveals to us both the source and the purpose of our freedom.

Christian freedom is not the freedom to do whatever you want to do. Christian freedom is the freedom to live in faithfulness to the way of Jesus Christ so that we are his incarnation in our world and instruments through whom the reign of God continues to unfold in our world. This is the purpose of the freedom won for us by Jesus Christ through his suffering, death and resurrection. Every day we make choices as to whether we will live in the freedom of this world – doing what we want to do – or whether we will live in faithfulness to our Christian freedom – doing what is in conformity with the life and teaching of Jesus Christ. Ironically, our Christian freedom places obligations on us. In order to live in conformity to the life of Christ, we must honor and respect the dignity of all human life. We must have a sincere concern for the needs of the poor and the marginalized of our society. We must forgive others without condition and without limit. We must use the gift of our human sexuality in a way that is appropriate to our state in life. To live in faithfulness to our Christian freedom, to live in faithfulness to Christ, liberates us from slavery to current opinions and popular prejudices so that we can be the incarnation of Christ for others and persons whose lives continue the unfolding of God's reign.

As you celebrate the Fourth of July this week, remember your Christian freedom!
