LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

When I hear the expression "Live Christ the King" two ideas come to mind. First the confession of faith expressed in the cry of the Mexican Jesuit martyr, Father Miguel Pro, minutes before his execution in Mexico City almost a century ago.

Second, the scene of the Last Judgment where we will be asked for accounts of our lives. The Solemnity of today ends the liturgical year. The Gospel scene of Matthew 25 is a third and final call to repentance. It is not bad to remember that with the parable of the 10 virgins we were encouraged to be attentive and vigilant in the face of personal salvation. With the parable of the talents we were invited to know how to invest and risk ourselves to achieve salvation. Now, with the parable of the final judgment, the challenge is to be ready for the encounter with Our Lord God of the Universe. The final judgment, far from causing us pain, anguish and fear, invites us, like the other two parables mentioned, to be at the joyful expectation of the Good Shepherd who comes in search of his sheep. Thus, the final judgment becomes the absolute moment of our lives in which we will be called to

reap the fruit of our good works. St. Augustine when contemplating this scene said that "at the end of the days we will be judged in love". Our good Pope Francis last weekend in St. Peter's Square, when he commemorated World Poor Day, once again insisted on the need for works and concrete actions that are imposed beyond words. In an unprecedented event, Pope Francis himself went to lunch with 1,500 poor people in the Paul VI Auditorium in Rome. Today Jesus, Christ the King, asks each of us what we have done for the poor, for the sick, the hungry or the strangers of our environment. Today each one of us is called to the events that are concretized in the works of mercy rather than the words that are carried by the wind. There is always the possibility that the Creator of the Universe finds us without works and sets us apart from his Kingdom because we have not welcomed the poorest people around us. Let us do good for the kindness that charity and mercy demand and so with joy the words of the supreme judge will resound in our ears "come blessed of my father, receive the inheritance of my kingdom".
