

(Luke 15: 11-32)

Both this Sunday and the next the central point of the Gospel is the infinite mercy of God. No matter how terrible it may be and no matter how painful the consequences of the prodigal son's or the adulterous woman's wrongdoing, the compassion of God is always greater. The popular song already says "if great are my faults, greater is your forgiveness."
 Of course these biblical passages are only a preparation for the contemplation of the true mercy that we will hear on the following Sunday: The death of Jesus on the Cross for our salvation.

A new dawn happens in each of today's readings. The Israelites finally arrive in the promised land and celebrate their Passover in his name. Saint Paul tells us that in Christ we are a new creation. The prodigal son is welcomed back into his home with joy because "he was dead and has come back to life." Today, as we listen to the readings, we are able to imagine that new days always await us for the mercy of God. Let us think that both young and old are called by Pope Francis to "do God's will."

If we allow ourselves to be captured by the word of St. Paul we must feel newly created because "the old has passed and the new has begun" (Corinthians 5:17). Because God has reconciled humanity through Christ, our sin has been erased and we are new creatures. We are no longer what we were in the past because of this saving grace and this is cause for joy. It is not in vain that the entrance antiphon of this Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as the Sunday of Laetare or rejoicing, wants to encourage us to continue walking in this route of faith. We are happy because God is always willing to forgive us. We are happy because Christ came to save us and not to condemn us. We rejoice in Jesus' coming victory over His death and suffering. Therefore full of hope, let us reconcile with God. Let us learn from the loving father who receives his prodigal son without asking anything and with open arms. Let us be merciful as our Father God, who always has the doors open, for our repentant return. Today is the Will that God wants; that we recognize our sins, so, our lives reach their fullness.

It's an opportunity for you to grow closer to God by deepening your experience of prayer and faith during this Holy Lenten Season. Registration is requested in order to prepare the proper amounts of reading materials. Participants need not worry if they cannot make every meeting, you may come to as many days as your time allows.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS - We offer Stations of the Cross **every Friday during Lent** immediately following the 12:05pm mass. The Stations of the Cross is a Lenten devotion that offers witness to Jesus' Passion and Death. At each station we use our senses and our imagination to reflect prayerfully upon Jesus' suffering, Death, and Resurrection, and to simply experience the visual images to reflect on Christ's love for us.

RECONCILIATION MONDAY - "Lighten Up. Experience the power of forgiveness this Easter." We invite everyone for Lenten Individual Confessions on Holy Monday, April 15th from 4pm to 8pm in the Parish House. A priest will be available to hear your confession. Cleanse your heart and your soul before Easter. Pope Francis tells us "Every time we go to confession, God embraces us."

2019 CARDINAL'S APPEAL - The Annual Cardinal's Stewardship Appeal has commenced and our parish goal has been set at \$35,000. Many parishioners have already received mail regarding the appeal and have responded generously. We have already received \$4,765 in pledges! We only ask that you be as generous as your means will allow. Our parish has consistently met its goal every year and we thank our parishioners for their immense sacrificial support.

PARISH NEWS – The Pastors Advisory Council discussed reinstating the St. Vincent DePaul Society in our Parish. If anyone is interested in helping others in need, please call the Parish Office and sign up so we can begin this worthwhile activity. What is the Society of St. Vincent de Paul? Members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (or "Vincentians") are men and women who strive to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to individuals in need. We are young and old.
