"How often should I forgive?" (Matthew 18: 21-35)

After the pandemic we have realized the importance of coming together as family and friends who worship the God of life, the God of mercy and the God who is always ready to forgive. However, what we affirm of God we are called to recreate in our lives. Therefore, let us ask the God of Life for the strength to forgive of brothers and sisters not seven times seven but always

Peter asked Jesus how many times he should forgive, as many as seven times? Jesus surprised Peter with hi answer. He teached a parable that dramatically explair the importance of forgiveness. In the first reading, the author of the Book of Ecclesiasticus teaches us the difference between revenge and forgiveness. That is why today more than ever we are called to be prophet of reconciliation and not to be a divided nation or a church that ignores others who may have done us wrong in the past. Today is God's present that encourages us to forgive and always be merciful.

Anger is a basic human emotion, its welling up within us perfectly naturally in many situations. However, if left to fester, or expressed as wrath or vengeance, it ca become poisonous. I do believe that sometimes it is necessary to express that anger or rage as the beginnin of a therapeutic process that leads us to reconciliation That is why it must be remembered that even Jesus wa angry at the vendors in the Temple area. It is fair and necessary to express our anger when any abuse is committed, whether in or out of church, home, or the workplace. That is why the author of the Book of Sirach tells us to "stop hating." In a similar way, Jesus proposal will be the one that leads us to total healing. Jesus' response is expressed in the so-called "golden rule." That is to forgive our enemies as we want to be forgiven. Forgiveness will always open the doors of reconciliation in any community.

Let us pray to the Lord of Mercy to remind us that ou task as believers is to always forgive. Forgiving is an attitude of life that implies living in the grace of a Gowho always forgives. That like Peter, the forgiven sinner, we may live our mission in a world that needs reconciliation.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISGTRATION FOR NEW/RETURNING CHILDREN 2020-21: In order to create smaller than usual classes for the 20-21 Religious Education school year, we are asking parents to register your children as soon as possible. All classes will continue to be offered on the same days and we are preparing for blended learning with a staggered schedule in order to be in compliance with social distancing. We will also offer 100% remote learning from home. Once your child is registered, the schedules will be communicated to the parents. In order for your children to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, they must attend two years of consecutive preparation in any religious education program. You can register your child/children by filling out the enrollment form on our website (olmcsi.org), uploading any required documentation and paying the required fees. Your may call or email us with any additional questions. Enrolling your children in our program every year helps secure them a solid, joyful foundation in the faith and helps qualify them to receive their sacraments on time with their peers.

<u>CELEBRATING MASSES SAFELY</u> - Following the guidelines of the Archdiocese and the requirements of the State of New York, with 25% capacity, our Church is open for Baptism, Weddings, Funerals and Confessions. We are **ALL** required to follow the following guidelines:

- 1. Wear a mask at all times in the Church, including the confessional. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED IN WITHOUT A MASK.
- **2.** Observe the 6 feet distance. (SOCIAL DISTANCING)
- **3**. Sit in designated areas and follow the signs posted around the the church.
- **4.** If you think you may have been exposed to the virus or if at any time you feel like you might have **ANY** virus related symptoms, we ask you to definitely stay at home and seek medical attention.
- **5.** Use hand sanitizers positioned at the rear of the Church and disinfect your hands as often as needed. You may also wish to bring hand sanitizer with you. The pews and other areas will be disinfected after each Mass.

<u>CHANGES IN THE LITURGY</u> - To limit the possibility of contagion, presentation of gifts, shaking hands at sign of peace, receiving on the tongue, and sharing the communion cup will be temporarily omitted. For the same reason, missalettes and hymn books have all been removed. Ushers will direct the communion procession one section at a time so that communicants can maintain a six-foot distance from one another. Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand only, in order to limit the transfer of saliva.

ARCHDIOCESE ANNUAL GOLDEN JUBILEE ANNIVERSARY MASS - Unfortunately, due to the uncertainty of large group gatherings in New York City, the Golden Jubilee Wedding Mass is now cancelled. To ensure all eligible couples are recognized for their faith, commitment and 50th Wedding Anniversary, the office of special projects will issue wedding certificates to commemorate this blessed sacrament of marriage. If you celebrated or will celebrate your 50th Anniversary in 2020, please contact the rectory by Sept. 15th so we can register you to receive your commemorative certificate.
