GAUDETE SUNDAY

"I am the voice that cries out in the desert" (John 1: 6-8, 19-28)

The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday because today's opening antiphon begins with the world gaudete, which means rejoice. We rejoice today, for the coming of the Lord is so near that we cannot help but think about it. Perhaps we are starting to feel overwhelmed by all we need to do between now and Christmas. Let this be an opportunity to refocus our attention on the true reason to celebrate this time of the year. Rejoice, the Lord is near. For our parish this joyful Sunday celebration adds to our gladness since yesterday we had a beautiful feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas.

At the end of a year dominated by the pandemic, some even want to forget the pain it has produced. That is why the three readings wish us to be reminded of the good wishes that the Scripture has for us with the imminent coming of our Savior Jesus Christ. Isaiah, whom we could say is the prophet of hope, announces a year of grace and the day of redemption. Saint Paul in his letter to the Thessalonians urges them to live according to their condition, that is, to always be ready for Christ's return. Paul invites us to receive a positive encouragement from those who feel saved by the grace of Jesus Christ. The Gospel reveals to us the humility of those who know how to recognize their identity without affirming themselves in the glories of others. John tells his interlocutors that he is not the Messiah but "the voice that cries in the desert."

If we put the Prophet Isaiah in context, we can affirm that his words came in a time when hopes were reborn. The Jewish people had been released from exile and could finally return to Jerusalem. In some way God is the owner of everything created and only to Him must everything return if we want to achieve original harmony. In Jesus all the promises of bringing good news to the sad, freedom to the captives, and justice to the oppressed are fulfilled.

Therefore this year with greater commitment we must rejoice because in Jesus we have been given the salvation that has freed us from death and leads us to live in the certainty of eternal life.

John is not the Messiah but the messenger. John is the one who has come to prepare the way of the Lord. That is why this paradigmatic figure, with an austere life, exotic dress and a diet more powerful than a low-fat one, invites each of us to prepare our hearts for Christmas. How do we do it? Recognizing Jesus in our neighbors. Let us recognize Jesus serving the least of our brothers and sisters.
