"The widow of the Gospel, like that of the Old Testament, gives everything, gives herself, and puts herself in God's hands, for the good of others. This is the perennial meaning of the offer of the poor widow, which Jesus exalts because she gives more than the rich, who offer part of what is left over, while she gives everything she had to survive, and thus gives herself." (Pope Francis)



"This poor widow put it more than all the others" (Mark 12: 38-44)

November and the wintertime hours that we changed today bring to my mind the novel "Wuthering Heights." The shorter days and winter shadows could be the cause of unhappy feelings that we may experience at this time of the year. Adding to that, on November 2, we just remembered the countless victims of the pandemic and our beloved faithful departed. However, it is normal to doubt our faith when we are consumed in the anguish and despair that grief and death produce. Death comes to us as a trauma that questions us multiple times for something we are unable to answer. Why did my mother have to die so soon? Why did God allow so much suffering from my brother? How will my family get through all of this? Let us ask the God of Life that we be able to clear up some doubts and grow in our faith in the God who comforts us.

Today's readings focus on two women whose deep faith sustains them in their pain and sadness. Although we know little about their lives, we identify them as two widows who have lost their husbands and thus have become part of the group of the financially and emotionally deprived. One of these widows has no food but just a little flour and oil. The other only has a couple of coins. Yet each of them is willing to offer what little they have for the service of God. In some way the sacrifice of these women is a preview of the sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross for the salvation of many.

In the story of Elijah, the prophet is taught by God to trust the generosity and acceptance of those who are strangers or foreigners in order to survive. In the Gospel story as well as in Elijah's, the widows want to be a reflection of what will be the last and eternal sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. They have no one to support them, they are destitute in the face of religion and the government. Both depend on the generosity of others. Interestingly, it is the generosity of these two women that makes it possible for them to be models of the generosity of Jesus' sacrifice. Each one is free to give God everything they had to live. That is why today more than ever these

widows teach us the value of life when we seem to immerse ourselves in the culture of having and possessing. Their sacrifice would seem crazy and for that reason it is countercultural. God is not afraid to sacrifice his only begotten Son for the salvation of many, so we can trust in his providence. The destruction of the Temple in a metaphorical way tries to announce the *sacrifice*, that in Jesus death and resurrection, offers us eternal life. As believers we are called to give our lives so that
