"Joy is orienting oneself to Jesus. Joy must be the characteristic of our faith. Even in dark moments, that inner joy must remain and we must know that the Lord is with us" (Pope Francis).



"Jesus transforms water into wine" (John 2: 1-11)

Just as we've begun the New Year, the liturgy proposes the Marriage at Cana as a reminder that the feast continues. Every Sunday we remember Jesus' gift of his own life as food and drink for eternal life. Today's Gospel wants to remind us that Jesus came for our salvation. so let us drink his wine and eat his body happily and in community. I think that the attitude of every believer, without falling into hedonism, should be a of true feast where there is no lack of wine and food because Jesus is with us. We should listen to the words of Pope Francis who does not want believers whose faces look like they've eaten bitter cucumbers. For Francis, every believer must show a face of joy as proof of our faith. Somehow this first SIGN of Jesus according to John's Gospel seeks to be a symbol of what it is to have the fullness of life with Jesus. Let us ask the Lord to grant us a year where our faith would motivate us to live in hope regardless of circumstances.

Celebrating Christ every Sunday supposes celebrating Him with the same enthusiasm and joy that every miracle of his love provokes in us. Do not forget about this message when we immerse ourselves in the daily routine. For this reason, rather than returning to the temptation to look at the past, let us focus our attention on the miracle of love that each Eucharist strives to be. We are all invited to eat and drink the Body and Blood of the Lord until he comes.

Today's readings reveal to us the **transformative effect** of God in our world. Isaiah prophesies that God will transform the Israelites and their land from "forsaken" to "espoused," as a suitor rejoices in his bride. Saint Paul extols the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which transform each person differently, but all to serve the same Lord and for the **benefit of the community**. The transformation of water into wine at a wedding in Cana of Galilee seeks to be a symbol of his glory and majesty that inspires his disciples to believe more in him. Curiously, at the Last Supper Jesus will once again transform not simple water but wine into his own Blood for the salvation of many. Today, as yesterday, we identify ourselves as his people to the extent that we believe in the power of his salvation and we allow ourselves to be transformed by his grace. Today is the time to live for others as Jesus did. Let the beginning of this new year be a time for God to transform

WONDROUS CHILD - In the Gospel scene at Cana, we see Mary turning to her own child, Jesus. Perhaps she recalled the power of the Spirit that had flowed in her womb at his Incarnation, leading her to discern that surely he must have Spirit-given gifts that could help with the impending crisis at the wedding. As at her Annunciation, she may not have been completely certain, at first, exactly how this would come about, but in faith at Cana she turned to Jesus. In faith, her words, "do whatever he tells you," echoed her reply to Gabriel: "Let it be done to me as you say." In faith, she knows whatever words the Word will speak are bound to bring another inbreaking of the Spirit, another manifestation of God's reign. And she is right. Her wondrous child, John the Evangelist tells us, performed his first wonder there, and signaled the presence of the divine in the everyday.

ORDINARY TIME – Begins on the Monday after the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus, and ends on the day before Ash Wednesday. As we enter into the liturgical period known as Ordinary Time, the Church tells us that the "ordinary" of Ordinary Time is the celebration of the "mystery of Christ in its entirety." In other words, the normal life of the Church is the entire mystery of Jesus Christ, which Christ himself pours forth into our lives by the liturgy. The mystery of Christ is the revelation of the Father's plan to save us through the incarnation, death, resurrection and ascension of His Son. We must strive to follow and fulfill in ourselves Christ's plan. How can we follow Christ? Accept God's love. Confess and repent of our sins. Experience the miracle of a changed life. Obey God's commandments by His grace and power. Maintain this victory through the daily study of scriptures, prayer and witnessing. Join God's true church.

The Beginning of Ordinary Time ... Ordinary time is represented by the liturgical color of green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of repairing the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of the glorious resurrection. Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!
