

Dear Parishioners,

As many of you are aware, the chapel floor is in need of repair. I delayed the repairs because (1) I was assured by contractors and inspectors the floor was not in danger of collapse; (2) I made the repairs part of last year's Renew and Rebuild Campaign in hope of raising funds; (3) without knowing the money that may or may not become available from the campaign, I couldn't determine exactly what we could afford to do. Finally, we only have a small window of opportunity every year during which we can close the chapel to do the work. That window is now.

That stated, in relation to our parish goal, we didn't raise enough money through the Renew and Rebuild Campaign. However, a very generous anonymous parishioner, another generous couple and approximately \$25,000 of parish funds have made it possible to redo the entire chapel floor. I have listed below the timetable. I apologize for the late notice but this was a very involved process with many moving parts. Everything is just getting finalized. The total cost is in the area of, but below, \$90,000.

Starting the weekend of February 3rd, all weekend Masses will be at St Peter's School. Daily Masses will be held at Our Lady of the Way Chapel, at the Culinary Institute of America (CIA), starting Tuesday, January 30th. During the repair of the chapel floor, there will be no Monday night Purgatorial Masses. During this period, funeral masses will be held at Regina Coeli Parish. Father Michael Morris, Pastor of Regina Coeli Parish, has been generous enough to permit us to use their parish church during our floor restoration.

Thank you for your understanding. Hopefully, we can celebrate Easter on a beautiful new chapel floor.

Next Sunday's Gospel

Mark 1: 21-28

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are — the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? 
