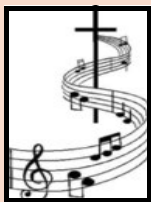


Act of Contrition

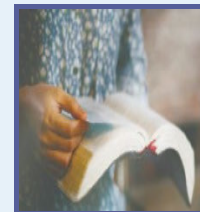

SPRING UPDATE

YOUR PARISH DEBT REDUCTION COLLECTION DONATION AT WORK

Every parish has to pay bills each month to the Archdiocese for, among other things, employee pensions, medical insurance, and PIP insurance, etc. because the Archdiocese covers these costs and then later seeks the amount from the parish. If the parish does not repay, a debt is incurred by the parish to the Archdiocese which it is expected to pay when it can. Mercifully, this debt to the Archdiocese does not accrue interest to the original amount owed.

As many of you know, St. Peter's has longstanding debts to the Archdiocese of New York both for the costs of running the Parish itself and for the many years it ran Saint Peter's School in order to provide many young people, perhaps you yourself, with a Catholic education. (Incidentally, it is because of the ever-mounting costs of running a school that only a few parishes (e.g. St. Martin de Porres) now have their financial resources to support their own parish school. Most Catholic Schools (e.g. Holy Trinity, St. Columba) are run as by the Archdiocese's Regional School System, with each parish making contributions to keep them operating.)

As of the end of **January 2023**, the total liability of St. Peter's Parish to the Archdiocese for Parish and Parochial School Debts was **\$934,078.75**.

As of the beginning of this **March 2025**, this debt has been further reduced to **\$881,941.74** thanks to YOUR generous contribution to the Parish Debt Reduction Collection. Thank you!

THE SIGN OF THE RAINBOW

Gen 9:13-16

When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant which is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will look upon it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is upon the earth."



Rev 4:2-3

At once I was in the Spirit, and lo, a throne stood in heaven, with One seated on the throne! And He who sat there appeared like jasper and carnelian, and round the throne was a rainbow that looked like an emerald.

This rainbow appeared over St. Peter's School Building on Tuesday Evening, March 11, 2025. The Rainbow is mentioned a few places in Sacred Scripture, most notably in the first and last books, Genesis and Revelation, respectively. In Genesis, after the flood sent to punish sinful humanity, the rainbow is named the sign of God's covenant not to destroy earthly life by a flood. In Revelation, the rainbow surrounds the Lord's throne as part of the heavenly liturgy. Anytime we see a rainbow we should pray an act of contrition, thank God for cleansing our sins in the waters of holy baptism and the absolution of holy penance, and joyfully yearn to worship the Lord at the Sunday Liturgy.

THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

March 25th marks the Solemnity miraculous conception of the eternal Son of God in the womb of the Virgin Mary. From this date, there are only nine months until Christmas day. Saint Luke the Evangelist interviewed the Blessed Mother and wrote down the details of the Incarnation. The Conception of Jesus was the wonderful moment when God became human in the womb of the most blessed of all human persons in order to make possible for human beings something greater than we could have ever hoped for. Remember to mark the day with prayer, especially the Hail Mary, using St. Gabriel's own words.

And the angel departed from her.

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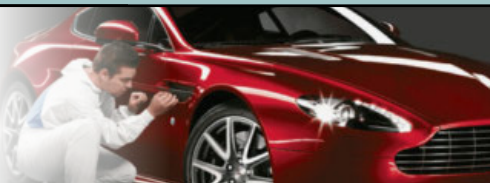
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
